# Kiddies Corner

## CHRISTMAS ROCKY ROAD

#### Ingredients

- 4oz dried cranberries / raisins
- 4oz shelled pistachios (I use unsalted)
- 4 oz desiccated coconut
- 12 oz mini marshmallows
- 4oz mixed glacé cherries, optional
- 10oz white chocolate chips (or chopped block of chocolate)

#### Instructions

- 1. Grease and line a 20cm (8 inch) square cake tin with baking paper.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, stir together cranberries, pistachios, coconut, marshmallows and glace cherries (if using).
- 3. Place white chocolate in a separate large heat-proof bowl and microwave at full power for 1 minute.
- 4. Stir and microwave in further 30 second bursts, stirring well in-between, until chocolate is completely melted and smooth.
- 5. Pour marshmallow mixture into the melted chocolate and stir until all the ingredients are well coated in chocolate.
- 6. Working quickly, pour mixture into the prepared tin and press down evenly.
- Refrigerate for 1 hour or until chocolate has set. To make the rocky road easier to slice, leave it at room temperature for 30 minutes before cutting into squares.

## **Gardening Tips for December and January**

Here we are again at the end of one year and beginning to prepare for another. As the Winter Solstice (the shortest day of the year) passes, the days begin to grow longer, so it is time to finish one set of tasks and prepare for the next. Even though the Solstice marks the beginning of winter, the coldest days are usually found in February, so there may be time to get out into the garden before bad weather prohibits activities, so here are a few jobs to be getting on with while waiting for the Brussel sprouts to cook!

#### **December:**

1) This is the traditional time to order seeds so it's worth checking what has been left over from the year before. With the life in years in brackets here is the life expectancy of seeds in unopened packets of the most common seeds: Beans  $\{2\}$ , Beetroot  $\{5\}$ , Carrot  $\{3\}$ , the common brassicas  $\{5\}$ , leek $\{3\}$ , Courgette  $\{6\}$ , Onion  $\{4\}$ , Parsnip  $\{1\}$  and Tomato  $\{3\}$ .

2) There is nothing to sow in December unless you wish to try some onions from seed in a greenhouse or cold frame. However, you must ensure that they are kept frost free. Diehard traditionalists start their onions off after Christmas lunch, but that may be a way of getting out of the washing-up!

3) Garlic can still be planted out and in fact benefit from a period of cold which prompts growth later.

4) If you have bought your early potatoes, you could start the chitting process in a cool room without too much direct sunlight. This will enable you to get an early planting of a few tubers in a cold frame or greenhouse when ready.

#### January:

1) Onions from seed can be sown in January. Keep the growing medium at or around 15°C so watch out on sunny days when the temperature in a greenhouse or cold frame can shoot up, even though it is cold outside.

2) To get the varieties of potatoes you want, get your order in for your seed potatoes.

3) If you are sowing indoors on a windowsill in a seed tray, a good tip to maximise the light available is to cover a piece of cardboard with aluminium foil and stand it to the north side of the seed tray. This will reflect extra light and prevent leggy seedlings. I think I remember Geoffrey Smith doing that many, many years ago on a BBC Gardening Programme.

In conclusion, a quote from Banksy which should be of interest:

"If you get tired, learn to rest, not quit!"
