

Gardening Tips for March

March can be the busiest month of the year, depending on the earlier preparations you have managed to accomplish. Digging on light soil could have been left until now whereas heavy soil dug in the autumn should have been broken down by frosts so that the spring work will be much easier once the ground has dried out sufficiently.

Here then are a few jobs we could be thinking about as we await the arrival of warmer days (and nights).

- 1] March sowings can suffer as a result of vicious frosts and cold drying winds. However, we can be consoled by the fact that one can usually sow again next month if this happens. In the meantime ground can be covered with cold frames, rows of cloches, which can make all the difference between success and failure. Even a sheet of polythene or spare fleece stretched over a seed bed will shield seeds from a few degrees of frost.
- 2] Spring sowing of broad beans can supplement the sowings that have been made at the backend of last year. They are perfect for succession sowing and should ensure pickings until mid-summer. Any infestation of blackfly can be hosed off and the vulnerable tops can be pinched out. They may need a light staking to help stop them from flopping.
- 3] Peppers and chillies should be started off as soon as possible because they need a long growing season in which to grow and ripen fruit. Sow in a heated propagator or in trays on a sunny windowsill.
- 4] If you are growing broad beans (see above) in double drills at full spacing ie leaving about 2ft between rows, there will be room to station-sow perpetual spinach (leaf beet) between rows towards the end of the month as a follow-on crop to harvest from early summer. Cut the broad beans to ground level when their crop is finished so that the spinach can take over in its turn.
- 5] In brief, a quick checklist of jobs: (a) Sow early peas. (b) Divide ageing clumps of perennial herbs. (c) Plant up new strawberry beds if not already done. (d) Plant out onion sets and seedlings raised under glass. (e) Plant early potatoes in the second half of the month. (f) Finally, make the first sowings of brassicas in a seedbed.

Finally, from Ogden Nash:-

Kiddies Corner

Cream Cheese Cookies

Ingredients

- 2 ½ oz Unsalted Butter at room temperature
- 3 oz Regular Cream Cheese at room temperature
- 1½ Icing Sugar
- ½ tsp Baking Powder
- 1 Egg at room temperature
- ½ tsp Pure Vanilla Extract
- 8 oz Plain Flour
- Caster Sugar

Method

- 1. Heat oven to 375 degrees and line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 2. Cream butter and cream cheese in mixer bowl.
- 3. Slowly add sugar and beat until fluffy.
- 4. Beat in egg, add flour, baking powder and vanilla extract. Mix Well.
- 5. Chill the dough for at least 1 hour. Shape into 1 inch balls, and roll in the caster sugar.
- 6. Place on lined baking sheet, spacing them about $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches apart, slightly flattening the dough balls before baking.
- 7. Bake for 8-10 minutes, or until the edges become slightly golden brown. They should look slightly under-baked (otherwise they won't be chewy).
- 8. Cool for 1 minute on cookie sheet then transfer to wire racks to cool completely.
- 9. Cookies can be stored in an airtight container for 3-5 days.







PLEASE PARK CONSIDERATELY

NOTES FROM THE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 03 FEBRUARY 2023

There were eleven members of the public present who came along to discuss:

Issues regarding the burger van at Main Road:

- a. County Cllr Bowkett will ask Parking enforcement to look into the matter of recovery vehicles being parked in the lay-bys all day, every day.
- b. County Cllr Bowkett will ask LCC to consider a 1 hour waiting time for the lay-bys.
- c. The PCSO will ask that the area be patrolled for parked vehicles causing an obstruction on the A16.
- d. The Police are not responsible for parking on the footway until the footway becomes impassable with a parked vehicle causing an obstruction. Photos can be sent to the Police directly or via the Parish Council.
- e. Dist Cllr Ashton will check the situation regarding planning permission to site a burger van in this position, being so near to the secondary school gates.

A planning application for 50 properties, a food store and light industrial units:

- a. The food store needs to be a food store and not changed when detailed plans are presented.
- b. If permission is given can there be a pub or a takeaway in the development?
- c. The appointment situation at the surgery and the numbers of children in school are left for the NHS and LCC to respond to, this is not a comment the Parish Council can use.
- d. Parking at the school will become even more of an issue. Parents can park at the Village Hall Car Park and walk their children to the school.

Questions regarding highway issues:

- a. The 30mph limit towards Spilsby being approved and signs are to be sited.
- b. A survey is to be carried out at the Sibsey end of the village to extend the 30mph limit.
- c. The crossing has been approved and funding is now being sought. This will be sited in the area of the surgery.

Apologies: received from Cllrs Bolland and Lawrence and Dist Cllr Jones

Present: Cllrs Pritchard, Cooper, Pavely, Sherriff and Edwards (Chairman)

Also present: PCSO Teresa Key (for the public forum), County Cllr Bowkett and Dist Cllr Ashton

Reports from Representatives in Outside Bodies

County Cllr Bowkett outlined an email that will be circulated to Councillors.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

The charge for green waste bins has risen to £50.00 and will not be increased for the next 4 years. Recycling is being changed nationally, this will see ELDC issuing purple bins, for dry paper and cardboard, to households and allowing glass to be placed in recycling bins, possibly from September 2022. Household waste sites will not be open seven days a week, the current times can be found online. No waste should be left at roadsides if the recycling site is closed, this is fly-tipping. ELDC are setting the precept, half of which normally goes straight to the drainage boards. More may be required by the drainage boards due to having to use white diesel instead of red diesel in the equipment. The increase to Council Tax will be 4.95% for 2022/2023.

Declarations of Interest

Cllrs Sherriff and Edwards declared an interest in Stickney Charities as they are the current representatives for the Parish Council. They have both agreed to do another four-year term on the Stickney Charities representing the Parish Council.

Planning Decisions received

There were no planning decisions for this meeting. Cllr Ashton will look into why the following applications have not been decided: S/169/01887/20 and S/169/01928/21

Planning applications received

OBSERVATIONS were made regarding the following application:

S/169/02583/21 - Moschatel Limited - Outline erection of a foodhall/shop, 4 industrial units and 50 residential dwellings (with means of access, layout and scale to be considered) at Land at Braybrooks House, Main Road

This proposed development is on land that is not allocated for development in the Local Plan. The development will alter the character of the village. If permission is granted can the food store remain a food store and not be changed to any other retail outlet? Can a post office be considered in the food store? Is there anywhere bottle banks can be sited in the light industrial area? Parking at both the schools needs to be considered. Is there anywhere on the site a pub or takeaway be opened?

S/169/02653/21 - Mr K Gostelow - Extension and alterations to existing outbuilding to provide a self-contained annexe at Old Rose and Crown, Main Road

S/169/00084/22 - Mr A Cuzens - Outline erection of 6 dwellings at Hollywood, Main Road

County Cllr Bowkett will be asked about the 30mph signs for the northern end of the A16 and if a road survey has been carried out at the southern end of the A16 through Stickney.
