St Luke's Church

This year we are hoping to decorate Stickney war memorial with a cascade of knitted/crocheted poppies for Remembrance Sunday. If you are able to help, please contact Bev Gosling for patterns and wool on 01205 480641. November seems a long way off, but we do need lots of poppies. So come on ladies or gents let's get those needles clicking.

Poppy Pattern

1 Ball red yarn (DK, 4mm/ size 8 needles) Scrap of black yarn or black button

Knitted Poppy

Main body of poppy

Using red cast on 60 stitches and work 10 rows double rib K2, P2 If you want a smaller poppy only do 8 rows of rib.

Row 11: K2 tog across the row (30 sts)

Row 12: Slip 1 K2 tog, pass slipstitch over, across the row (10 sts)

Break with enough yarn to stitch up poppy and thread back through remaining stitches and pull tight. Join edges to make a poppy.

Centre of poppy

Using black cast on 16 sts then cast off all the sts leaving a long length. Coil into a spiral and sew base to the centre leaving a long length at the back. Do not cut. Or use a black button with 4 holes and sew to the centre leaving a trailing thread at the back. Please leave two strands to tie onto the matting.

Crochet Poppy

Using a 4.5 mm hook, Ch3 join with slst to form a circle Ch3, work 9 dc into the centre of the circle and join with a slst.

Work the 3 petals separately.

Petal 1: Ch3 work 1 st dc into same st, work 2dc into next 3 sts.

Ch 1 work 2sc into each st, tie off.

Petal 2: Work 2 dc into last dc of previous petal, work 2 dc into next 3 sts.

Ch 1 work 2 sc into each st, tie off.

Petal 3: Work as petal 2.

Sew all ends in and attach button to centre. Leave two strands at back

Gardening Tips for April

There are many good reasons for us to invest our time and effort in growing our own vegetables. The news about price increases in food, the international situation, which appears to be worsening by the day, the damage done to the environment by lorries delivering food to supermarkets from sources many miles from our doors (asparagus from Peru!) plus plastic used in packaging are all considerations. Besides the cash savings and the pleasure to be derived from growing at home, we could all be prepared, if possible, to get a few packets of seeds and get sowing!

Here, then, are a few jobs to be getting on with as we enjoy the lengthening days and the warming weather:

- [1] We will all be beginning to sow our carrot seeds. The carrot fly is a pest which can ruin the growing vegetable, leaving it pitted with holes and inedible. A fleece protection erected around the crop to a height of two feet or thrown over the carrots will help. Another approach is to grow the carrots between onions and shallots as the alliums mask the scent of the carrots and the fly can't locate them. However you protect them, the secret with growing carrots as with a lot of vegetables (peas, dwarf beans, broad beans, radishes and, of course, potatoes) is to sow a new batch every couple of weeks.
- [2] Preparatory jobs include digging out any perennial weeds such as nettles, ground elder and bindweed. Any bare patches of soil should be covered with garden compost which will improve the condition of the soil or, if available, with well-rotted manure.
- [3] By now we should be sowing radish and beetroot but hold off if the weather turns colder and be prepared to sow again if necessary.
- [4] Leeks should be sown now, ready for planting out later in the year. Don't, however, be tempted to sow runner beans, French beans, sweet corn or courgettes, as it is still too cold. Wait till later in the month.
- [5] Tomatoes will be growing away in the small seed trays and will be ready to be re-potted into individual pots when the first 'true' leaves appear. If they go leggy bury them up to the first set of leaves as this will encourage a good root system.

As usual, I've barely scratched the surface. The main thing is to grow what you and your family fancy and enjoy what you get out of your efforts.

In conclusion, an observation from Robin Williams, now sadly deceased:

"Spring is nature's way of saying: "Let's party"

Well, let's party!"

Welsh Rarebit Muffins

Ingredients

- 225g self-raising flour
- 50g plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ½ level tsp bicarbonate of soda
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ level tsp mustard powder
- 100g strong cheese , half grated, half cubed
- 6 tbsp vegetable oil
- 150g Greek yogurt
- 125ml milk
- 1 egg
- 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce



Method


- Heat oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas 6.
- Mix together the self-raising and plain flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, salt and mustard powder in a bowl.
- In a separate bowl, mix the cheese, oil, yogurt, milk, egg and Worcestershire sauce.
- Combine all the ingredients and divide between the muffin cases in the muffin tin.
- Place in the oven for 20-25 mins until golden. Remove and cool slightly on a rack.
