Gardening Tips for November

There has been a noticeable change in weather conditions in the past few weeks and those days of 40 degrees plus are but a distant memory (thank goodness from a personal view). It is getting colder but not necessarily wetter as we draw into November. Trees are looking magnificent with the changing leaves producing all manner of hues and colours. The main jobs in the vegetable garden have to do with maintenance and preparing the garden for future frosts. However, there is still some sowing to do this month to keep the garden ticking over, so here's a list of jobs to do in the garden during the month.

1} Talking of leaves, if you are lucky enough to have trees in your garden, then collecting the leaves and putting them into a plastic bag which is then perforated is a good way of ensuring a future supply of humus. Simply wet the leaves, seal the bag and leave in an out-of-the-way position for a couple of years, will reward you with excellent friable leaf mould which can be dug into the ground and thus improve the soil.

2} Don't forget to encourage hungry birds into the garden by providing bird baths and bird feeders. The birds will keep the garden pest numbers down as well as providing a focal point of interest.

3} Parsnips are at their best after the first frosts when their flavour will be enhanced.

4} Autumn sown onion, shallot and garlic sets will be a huge investment for early summer next year. They will develop their roots ready to burst into their growing cycle in the spring as soon as the soil warms up.

5} If you have access to farmyard manure, now is a good time to spread it thickly on the ground. Either spread black plastic over the top of it and let the worms do their job or let it rot down naturally over the winter ready for digging in during the spring.

6} You might like to stake top-heavy brassicas and also to draw up the soil around the base of their stem/stalk to prevent wind rocking the plant.

7} Keep an eye on your summer harvest of onions and remove any rotting bulbs immediately. The 'pong' will usually guide you to any that need throwing out.

8} Again check potatoes and remove any that have not kept well and are rotting.

In conclusion then, a word from one of our revered poets, Emily Dickinson:

“November always seemed to me the Norway of the year”.
I think I know what she meant.

Another Japanese poet summed it up as:

“Autumn is marching on: even the Scarecrows are wearing dead leaves”.

Bonfire Toffee


Ingredients

- oil, for greasing
- 450g dark brown sugar
- 125ml hot water
- ¼ tsp cream of tartar
- 115g black treacle
- 115g golden syrup



Method

- Line the base and sides of an A4 sized tin with non-stick parchment and then grease it really well.
- Put the sugar and hot water in a heavy bottomed pan and heat gently until the sugar is dissolved, do not stir the mixture at any point instead tilt the pan if you need to move it around.
- Weigh out your remaining ingredients, if you put them in a really well greased jug they will be much easier to pour out. Once the sugar has dissolved add all the ingredients and pop the sugar thermometer in, you can use the thermometer to give it a quick swirl but try not to mix it too much.
- Bring to the boil and boil until you reach soft crack on your thermometer (270/140C) This may take up to 30 minutes, be patient and do not leave the pan unattended as it can change quickly. As soon as it reaches the temperature, tip it into your tin and leave it to cool.
- Once cool remove it from the tin a break up with a toffee hammer or rolling pin. Store in an airtight tin or wrap up in boxes or cellophane bags to give as gift.

Road Safety - E Scooters

What is an e-scooter?

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of “powered transporters”; this covers a range of personal transport devices which are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the [Road Traffic Act 1988](#), which means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence, insurance, and tax.

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces. If you're using a private e-scooter you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for no insurance.

If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter the incident will be investigated in the same way, it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car.

Reports from Representatives in Outside Bodies

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

ELDC offices are to be re-located to the old college in Horncastle. There are to be two reservoirs sited near Grantham and near Sleaford. A Teenage Market is to be held in Horncastle, this is for young crafters to sell their goods with the stalls being free of charge. The three councils are currently looking for tenders from businesses to be responsible for CCTV with regard to littering and dog fouling. ID will be required when voting in the elections next year. Volunteers are required on the day to work at polling stations. Lincolnshire Police have a free safeguarding wristband for anyone living with dementia. The wristband hold details of the person to call should the wearer be out and about and unsure of where they are. The Clerk asked about the difference in dates for paying the precept in East Lindsey compared with that in Boston Borough, if the finance is under the same 'umbrella'. There is an issue with planning too, no response has been received for a question emailed on 14 September. The reply received regarding the outstanding applications dated 2020 and 2021 is not really good enough. Dist Cllr Jones will look into the above matters and report back to the Parish Council.
