Register To Vote

Why register to vote? Being on the electoral register means that you can vote in the next election on 04 May 2023 – East Lindsey District Council and Parish Council elections.

The biggest change in electoral registration in 100 years was introduced on 10 June 2014 which makes everyone responsible for registering themselves. This new method of registration is called Individual Electoral Registration (IER) and its aims are to have an accurate and complete electoral register and combat electoral fraud.

Some key points of the change mean that:-

People can register on-line at the gov.uk website.

People will need to register individually - in the past forms were sent to the property and any of the occupiers could register those persons living at the address (Most people who were registered to vote in 2014 were automatically transferred on to the new register. Persons automatically transferred onto the new register received a letter of confirmation.)

Individuals who want to register will need to provide details to register including their national insurance number and date of birth.

If you, or any member of your household, are not registered, then contact ELDC and obtain an application form or register online at gov.uk

Further information can be obtained from the Electoral Services Office at ELDC on 01507 601111 or <u>email: elections.elections@e-lindsey.gov.uk</u>

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections. This will apply to: Local elections; Police and Crime Commissioner elections; UK parliamentary by-elections and Recall petitions. From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections.

If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

You will be able to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate on the **gov.uk** website.

If you need any help with applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or want to request an application form, contact ELDC on 01507 601111.

The online application form will be available from late January 2023.



The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate is 5.00pm on 25 April 2023 ready for the election on 04 May 2023.

Residents MUST register to vote before applying for the Voter Authority Certificate. When registering you will be asked if you have any photo ID.

Butter Cookies

Ingredients

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup Butter, softened

1 large Egg

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Sprinkles

Method

STEP 1 Heat oven to 400°F.

STEP 2

Combine sugar, butter and egg in bowl. Beat at medium speed, scraping bowl often, until well mixed. Add all remaining ingredients *except* sprinkles; beat at low speed, scraping bowl often, until well mixed.

STEP 3

Shape dough into 1-inch balls. Roll in sprinkles. Place, 2 inches apart, onto ungreased cookie sheets. Flatten slightly with bottom of glass. Bake 6-8 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool completely. Store in airtight container at room temperature.

Gardening Tips for February

The tips for February are based on an article I read recently in a daily newspaper, so apologies if anyone has read them before. It was full of ideas for gardeners who want to get a head start and get ahead of the game. Here then are some things to consider as we await the warmer days of Spring.

1} Sowing broad beans early indoors means they can be in your garden before the black-fly cycle starts. Planting out in March means they can be harvested in May.

2} Cauliflowers, which are prone to bolt if we have a warm summer, are good to start indoors, sow at the end of January, plant out mid-March and harvest in June to July.

3) Chillies and aubergines, which originate from hot countries, can be sown as soon as possible, as they need extra time to ripen.

4) Onions benefit from being started off from seed now. They can then be planted out from mid-March, which leads to much healthier and bigger onions.

5} Whatever you are growing, remember not to over water the seedlings because they can be deprived of oxygen and will die.

6} Think of growing microgreens i.e. the seedlings of a plant, and eating them at a much earlier stage. They can be used for sprinkling in Sandwiches, on soups or even over dinner for health benefits. This is also a good way of using excess seeds from packets which often contain 500 seeds. Grow them in a seed tray lined with a thin layer of damp kitchen towels and sprinkle the seeds on top. Place the container on a sunny windowsill. Within fourteen days they should be ready. Think of cress, coriander, peas, watercress, rocket and brassicas will give good results.

In conclusion, an observation from Mark Twain who said: 'A cauliflower is nothing but a cabbage with a college education.'

<u>Highways</u>

An email has been received from a resident regarding the safety issues in the area of the Pinfold Lane junction both for cars and those walking into the village. This will be passed to County Cllr Bowkett for LCC to consider.

An email has been received from LCC regarding proposed waiting restrictions around junctions in the area of both the schools – there were no issues with them. Mandatory 'School Keep Clear, Monday to Friday 8.00am – 4.00pm outside both schools – there are no issues with this. Bus stand, by William Lovell school, and Lay-by in Hall Lane to be kept clear Monday to Friday 8.00am – 4.00pm – there is no reason to have these areas unavailable for parking during school time both for local businesses on the Main Road and for the Church and Cemetery in Hall Lane. The two bus stops to be clearways (no parking) Monday to Saturday 8.00am – 4.00pm – there is no need for this to accommodate six buses a day. The bus stops are used as lay-bys quite safely and have been for many years.
