Kiddies Corner

Welsh Cakes - try these for St David's Day 1st March

Ingredients

- 225g white self-raising flour
- 110g salted butter cubed
- 85g white caster sugar
- 1 medium free range egg
- Few drops whole milk if needed
- 55g sultanas



Method

- Put the flour and butter in a large bowl.
- Rub them together until the texture is like breadcrumbs
- Add the sugar and egg together
- Mix in with a fork. If you find it's a bit dry then add a drop or two of milk.
- Stir in the sultanas
- Bring together into a dough
- Turn out on to a floury surface
- Roll out to about 5mm thick
- Cut out circles using a cookie cutter the dough should be really easy to work with.
- Warm a frying pan over a medium heat.
- Cook for about 3 minutes on each side, until golden brown

Gardening Tips for March

As I write Spring seems a fair way off. We've had two very cold periods followed by periods with temperatures just sneaking into double figures. I have to remember, however, that these notes are written for early March when, in theory, things in the garden really start to move. Longer days, sunnier, warmer conditions and an unbounded eagerness to get out into the garden should all prompt us to be thinking of things to do in our gardening plots. Here then are a few to be thinking of.

- 1} A tip from my favourite magazine, 'The Oldie', broccoli comes in too many guises to write about here. However, tenderstem broccoli, if sown in mid-March under cover should be ready for harvesting at the end of June. Seed sown outside from late April will give a later picking. My favourite, the purple-sprouting broccoli, needs up to ten months before it is ready. It presents immense challenges to protect it from the ravages of the cabbage-white butterfly.
- 2) For the earliest of early potatoes (a) heat up a patch of ground with cloches or plastic sheeting and (b) start chitting the seed potatoes by standing them up in a frost-free place with the rose end up. Look for small dots or eyes. Check after a week or so to see if you have them the right way up.
- 3} As the month progresses, begin to sow a few lines of carrots. The soil should be finely prepared, not recently manured and free of stones. Early sowings should be protected with cloches. Early carrots such as Amsterdam and Nantes types are good for first sowings.
- 4} It is now time to think about sowing tomato seeds. A favourite of mine is 'Tigerella'. They are tasty and have striped skin and have the advantage of producing many fruits. Wait until late March or April if you are planning to sow outdoor crops.
- 5} Onions and shallots should be planted now in modules. Leave in a bright cool spot until roots appear at the bottom of the tray and plant out 10cm and 25cm apart respectively.

Finally two observations on weeds: one from Ralph Waldo who said:

"What is a weed?

A plant whose virtues have never been discovered."

The other from A. A. Milne:

"Weeds are flowers too, once you get to know them."

NOTES FROM THE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 02 FEBRUARY 2023

There were two members of the public present. They came along to ask/report:

The 30mph speed limit signs that should be on the A16 where it has been agreed that the limit be reduced. County Cllr Bowkett is looking into this as the signs should be in place now.

Will the speed be reduced at the southern end of the A16. County Cllr Bowkett reported that checks had been carried out and they were not meeting the required criteria to reduce the speed limit further. Where will the zebra crossing be sited? County Cllr Bowkett reported that a site meeting will take place to find the safest place for the crossing. Some of the drains along the A16 are blocked. County Cllr Bowkett will ask that the drains be jetted. Some parents park over private driveways while waiting for children, can the driveways have white lines painted across them to prevent driveways being blocked? County Cllr Bowkett will look into this. There is a dip in the footway by School Close after works have been carried out by a utility company – this will be reported to LCC by County Cllr Bowkett. The Parish Council have supported a planning application for an outline development that could consist of 25 properties. There were no actual planning reasons to give to object to the application. Will waiting times be put in the lay-bys on the A16 in the village? This will be looked into.

Also Present: County Cllr Bowkett and Dist Cllr Jones

Reports from Representatives on Outside Bodies:

County Cllr Bowkett reported:

COVID is still about and everyone should be encouraged to have the booster vaccinations. With strikes taking place in the NHS residents should dial 111 wherever possible. LCC are raising their section of the Council Tax by 5%. Adult Social Care had a shortfall of £19m in 2022. Dogs being kept in a caravan at East Fen Lane are causing a nuisance to residents in both Stickney and in Midville. LCC and ELDC are aware of this issue.

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

Green bins for garden waste are due for payment at a cost of £50.00. ELDC has moved to the new Hub in Horncastle, the buildings at Manby have been sold. Skegness town hall has been purchased by the Royal Hotel. ELDC are keeping an eye on a court case regarding sea front hotels in Great Yarmouth being used for migrants when they are for the use of holiday makers.

ELDC will increase their section of the Council Tax by 5%. 54% of all council tax is for the local drainage boards, the MP has been asked to try and get a levy for this payment as it only applies to Lincolnshire and Norfolk.

Comments regarding the new proposals for the lay-bys/bus stops at Main Road

The new proposals for the lay-by on Hall Lane are acceptable, as are the restrictions at junctions of Mary Lovell Way, Holmes Road and Hall Lane. The proposals for the lay-by/bus stops at Main Road are not reasonable for the six service buses each weekday. There is no service on a Saturday. If the lay-bys have a clearway it will force the Post Office collection van to park on the Main Road as will any delivery drivers, this will cause a hazard on the A16. Have there been any incidents in the lay-bys that have suggested these proposals be put in place?
