Kiddies Corner

Crispy Chocolate Fridge Cake

Ingredients

- 300g dark chocolate, broken into chunks
- 100g butter, diced
- 140g golden syrup
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 200g biscuit, roughly chopped
- 100g sultana
- 85g Rice Krispies
- 100-140g mini eggs (optional)
- 50g white chocolate, melted



Method

- Line a 20 x 30cm tin with baking parchment. Melt the chocolate, butter and golden syrup in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water, stirring occasionally, until smooth and glossy. Add the vanilla, biscuits, sultanas and Rice Krispies, and mix well until everything is coated.
- Tip the mixture into the tin, then flatten it down with the back of a spoon. Press in some mini eggs, if using, and put in the fridge until set. When hard, drizzle all over with the melted white chocolate and set again before cutting into chunks.

PUBLIC NOTICE

LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (STICKNEY – VARIOUS ROADS) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting as set out in the Schedule below:

Hall Lane, Stickney

- Taxi Bay, Monday – Friday, 8am-9am and 3pm – 4pm.
- Mandatory School Keep Clear, Monday to Friday, 8am – 9am and 3pm – 4:15pm outside Stickney C of E primary school
- Bus Stand, Monday – Friday, 8am – 9am and 3pm -4pm
- No Waiting at Any Time on the junctions of Holmes Road, Mary Lovell Way, Hall Lane where it meets with the A16 and a section outside of Stickney C of E Primary school.

A16 Main Road, Stickney

- Mandatory School Keep Clear, Monday to Friday, 8am – 9am and 3pm – 4:15pm outside William Lovell Secondary school.
- 2 X Bus Stop Clearways, Monday – Saturday, 8am – 6pm.
- No Waiting at Any Time near the junction with Hall Lane to replace the existing Keep Clear markings.

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.

Gardening Tips for April

We seem to be in a period of fluctuating weather conditions making it very difficult to think about what and when to sow: last week we had some of the coldest nights of the year, but we seem, at the moment, to be set for some average temperatures which should encourage us to get out in the garden and get busy. A handy rule of thumb is not to sow seeds when the soil sticks to your boots. So here are some suggestions to think about while we await the onset of warmer conditions.:

- 1} Now is the time to plant first early potatoes. These should be well chitted by now and will provide first pickings in about eighty days. Keep an eye out for any forecasts of frost and be prepared to cover them with cloches or horticultural fleece - or both.
- 2} Onion sets can also go in now. They should be planted 5 to 10cm apart to make hoeing easier and placed in the ground just deep enough so that the bulb tips are just visible above the soil. Again, the use of fleece or netting will protect the plants from birds until they have become established and are growing well.
- 3} Salad onions can now be sown. As well as the usual White Lisbon, I'm trying a variety of pickling onions called '(Silverskin) De Paris'. The seeds produce small round bulbs which can be used in casseroles. They are ideal for patio containers and grow quickly.
- 4} My first sowing of carrots will be Royal Chanteney. They are smaller and sweet and again are ideal for containers. Early sowings will benefit from protection under cloches. The seeds should go into lightly watered rows and, as always with seeds, keep the soil damp until germination is evident.
- 5} This year I'm limiting myself to growing just four courgette plants. I've seen them referred to as 'glut-bringers' of the 'grow-your-own' world. That being so, I'm going for an F1 variety called Tuscany. It is a vigorous variety producing few spines, so it is easy to pick. It is also resistant to powdery mildew and produces a large supply of very dark straight fruits. Whichever variety is grown it is best to place the seed on its side. If sown flat, there is a small risk of rot. Sowing two seeds per small pot and removing the weaker one if both germinate is a good insurance.

And in conclusion, a word of advice:

If you ever need advice on buying a fern,
you can always ask a frond.
Although with fronds like these,
who needs anemones?

NOTES FROM THE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 02 MARCH 2023

There was one member of the public present who came along to listen to the meeting.

Present: Cllrs Pritchard, Sherriff, Edwards and Pavely and Bolland (Chairman)

Also Present: Dist Cllr Jones and Dist Cllr Ashton (7.45pm)

Reports from Representatives on Outside Bodies:

County Cllr Bowkett reported (by email):

Email received regarding the 30mph signage for the A16:

“Thank you for your email regarding the new speed limit changes in Stickney. These are progressing and we have emphasised that they are a priority to be completed as soon as possible. The signs are currently in design and some of the new signage requires illumination/isolation of previous supply, so the Traffic, Signs and Lines and Streetlighting teams are all working closely to move this on. The Officer is also keeping a close eye on it to ensure it is treated as urgent. A conservative estimate is that they will be fully completed in the summer months, however, I am optimistic that they can and will be completed much sooner than this.”

Email received regarding standing traffic lights:

“I have carried out an investigation into what happened at Stickney and have found the following: I believe the works in question are in conjunction with an Anglian Water Burst Main which was under two way temporary traffic signals from 9 – 29 November. The reason why lights were up so long was there was the burst main was under a Sewer Pumping control station meaning specialist parts were required to be ordered in and they had to carry out a mains diversion into the road itself to repair the burst. As the works took longer than they was originally anticipated we requested that the New Development Works to upgrade site access and carry out other utility works which were planned in to take place were completed under the ongoing Anglian Water lights so that collaboration could take place minimising disruption on this stretch of the road in the future. Hope this helps clarify why the lights were up for so long and if there is any further queries don't hesitate to ask.”

Dist Cllr Jones reported (in the public forum):

ELDC have set the Council Tax - £161.64 for a Band D property, an increase of 4%. ELDC will receive £80.00 of this whilst the rest will go to the Drainage Boards. Support grants are available for families, details can be found on the ELDC website. Dist Cllr Jones was asked if he and Cllr Ashton would be available to give a talk at the Annual Parish Meeting with regard to the planning system. He suggested Cllr Ashton and a Planning Officer would be best suited for this.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

Issues at East Fen Lane with dogs are being dealt with, the owner is working with the authorities to resolve any issues. A planning application is being put together for a property on East Fen Lane. Cllr Ashton was asked to speak about planning at the Annual Parish Meeting, he agreed that he would and just needed the date confirming.
