# **Kiddies Corner**

# **Frozen Yogurt Bites**

# **Ingredients**


40g granola
200g Greek-style yogurt
150g fresh fruit of your choice
(such as berries, mango or pineapple),
chopped



# **Method**

- Divide 40g granola between the holes of an ice cube tray, this will fill about 20-24 holes so you may need 1-2 trays depending on size.
- ➤ Spoon in 200g Greek-style yogurt to cover the cereal, then top each with a few pieces of fruit, chopped if large (you'll need about 150g of fresh fruit such as raspberries, blueberries and mango).
- ➤ Freeze the trays until solid (1-2 hrs) or until needed. The frozen bites will keep for up to 1 month in the trays or can be transferred to an airtight container.
- ➤ Allow to soften for a few minutes at room temperature, then pop out of the trays to serve.





# **MAKE AN ORIGAMI FROG**

#### You will need

Coloured paper measuring 15x9cm Googly eyes (optional)

## Method


Step one




Fold the rectangle in half vertically and then unfold. Bring the top right corner down to the left diagonally and unfold.

Step two

Bring the top left corner down to the right diagonally and unfold. Then turn the paper over.




# Step three



Fold the top of the rectangle down where the diagonal folds meet, unfold, and turn the paper over again.

Step four

Bring the sides to the centre, so they meet each other (this is called a squash fold). Then flatten the top of your rectangle to make a triangle.



## Step five



Fold the two corners of the triangle up to the top point of triangle. Fold the left side of the paper towards the centre and repeat with the right side.


## Step six

Fold the two flaps at the top of the triangle in half so they point out (as shown in picture). Fold the bottom of the paper up to the top corner of the triangle, then fold the paper down to the bottom edge.



Turn the whole thing over to reveal your jumping frog and finish by sticking on some googly eyes or drawing your own with felt tip pen.

# **Gardening Tips for July:**

At long last we have real summer weather with a pleasant breeze, making it bearable. We have not had any appreciable rain for quite a while, so extra watering may be needed. As I write it is only a week or so away from the June solstice and the days will begin to shorten. Still, here are a few jobs we can be getting on with to make the most of what could be described as perfect gardening weather.

- 1} Every year I try to develop a sow-plant-crop regime for my lettuces, this year it looks as if I might succeed at last! There are two approaches that can be taken either sow for hearty lettuces, in which case they need to be about a foot apart, or sowing some cut-and-come-again salad leaves, which can be sown closer together. Either way it should be possible to have home grown lettuces well into the autumn.
- 2} July is the last month for sowing carrot seeds. By sowing the seed thinly you cut down on the need to thin, which can attract the carrot fly. Using a mesh screen will give good protection. Watch out for aphids, especially the carrot-willow aphid which causes leaves to turn yellow or red and stunts growth.
- 3} To go with the lettuce in your salads, radishes are quick to mature, and as a bonus for gardeners are almost pest free. They can be sown right up to the end of August and may be harvested almost to the year end. Beautiful in salads and they make a handy crunchy snack on their own or try sliced in a stir-fry.
- 4} By now runner and French beans will be producing. It is worthwhile putting a second sowing of both which will allow pods time to mature before the first frosts of Autumn. With this warm weather and careful watering the seeds can be sown directly into the ground, with a very good chance of germination. If you wish to try a type which are ideal for drying and using up in winter stews, then Borlotto have colourful mature pods and have a pleasant texture and flavour.
- 5} Keep an eye on your strawberries and be prepared to use the runners, which they produce in Autumn, to replenish or add to your stock. Either wait for them to grow into little plants in the ground or using a small plant pot filled with John Innes 1 or 2, guide the growing runner into the pot which can then be retained with a U shaped piece of wire, inverted, to hold in place until the plantlet is rooted and established. Plant out next spring.



## WITHAM FOURTH DISTRICT IDB

2022 turned out to be a very dry year with hardly any rainfall from April 2022. We pumped for 8,271 hours (2021 - 13,040hrs) and average rainfall to December 2022 was only 421mm (2021 - 535mm). Over time, an average year would see around 578mm of rainfall.

For a second year, this meant that we were able to concentrate on our maintenance programme and repairing the numerous slips that occur (there is another one on the Fodderdike Drain that will shortly be repaired). We continue to work hard on a number of funding bids for capital projects and over the next 15 years, there is an ambitious Capital Replacement Programme totalling £55M that will be almost entirely funded by DEFRA.

In 2023 we will begin working on a new pumping station at Wrangle that will replace the existing station built in the 1940's at a cost of £4M. Replacement weed screen cleaners and control panels at our Lade Bank Pumping Station have been completed in 2022 that will help with the significant weed build up we get in front of our Pumping Stations, when were are pumping.

This continued investment will ensure that we are able to maintain the standard of protection for the district.
