Kiddies Corner

Cheese & Vegetable Frittata

Ingredients

- 2 tsp olive, sunflower or vegetable oil, for greasing
- 4 large free-range eggs
- 50ml/2fl oz milk or cream
- handful grated cheddar or crumbled feta
- freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tbsp chopped fresh herbs such as parsley or chives (optional)
- 10 cherry tomatoes (can be left whole or halved)
- 1 red pepper, chopped
- handful frozen peas, defrosted
- 50g/1¾oz broccoli, chopped into small



Method

- 1. Adult's job: preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4.
- 2. Kid's job: Rub the oil over the inside of a 20cm/8in square oven-proof dish or 6-hole muffin tin with a bit of kitchen roll or a pastry brush.
- Kid's job: Break the eggs one by one into a small bowl so you can check if there
 is any egg shell in the bowl. If there is you can fish it out with a spoon. Tip each
 egg into a big bowl when you have checked for shell. Wash your hands after
 handling eggs.
- 4. Kid's job: Add the milk or cream to the eggs. Whisk the eggs with a fork or metal whisk until it is light and fluffy.
- 5. Kid's job: Add half of the grated cheese and a little ground black pepper. You can also add herbs if you like.
- 6. Kid's job: Put the vegetables you want to use into the oven proof dish. If you are using a muffin tin you can choose which vegetables go in each of the holes. Pour the egg and cheese mixture onto the vegetables and sprinkle the rest of the cheese on top.
- 7. Adult's job: Place the tin or dish in the oven for 20 minutes so that the frittata is golden-brown and set. Check that it is cooked in the middle by poking in a sharp knife. If it is still loose return the dish to the oven until set. Leave to cool a little before removing from the tin with a heatproof spatula. You can eat it warm or cold



Gardening Tips for July:

According to today's weather presenter, our weather at the moment seems to be coming in blocks of four to six weeks. So we had a dry February, a wet March, a cold May and early June, then a blast of hot weather in June and early July. According to that theory, the way July is developing, we should be in for a very changeable July. Who knows what August will bring? Here then are some ideas we could be getting on with as we wait and see.

August:

- 1) Watch out that you water regularly. Irregular watering can lead to problems with blossom end rot in tomatoes, splitting of root vegetables and the loss of flowers on runner beans.
- 2) Weeds are great competitors of vegetables for any available water. They act as a host for pests and diseases, so regular hoeing is called for.
- 3) If growing marrows, they should be raised off the ground slightly, to prevent them being discoloured from contact with the soil.
- 4) Finally, what to plant in August? It is best to concentrate on fast growing vegetables such as lettuce. Even later sown lettuce can be overwintered in greenhouses or beneath cloches for picking next spring. Other favourites are oriental leaves, rocket, corn salad and of course, spring onions. If sowing the latter, note that onions don't germinate well in temperatures regularly above 20°C, (a lesson I learnt to my cost recently).

September:

- 1) Spinach can be sown now for picking next spring. The seeds should be sown directly in shallow drills, in well prepared soil or alternatively, in pots. Cover with a fleece or a low cloche from October onwards.
- 2) If you sow broad beans in Autumn, it means the plants can establish over winter and be cropped early next spring. It is a good idea to have some fleece readily available in case we get a hard frost or snow. Aquadulce Dulce seems to get the nod from most gardeners as the best for Autumn sowing.
- 3) Again, like broad beans, peas can be sown in September to overwinter with the same advantages. Try Douce Provence or Meteor.
- 4) Finally, where would we be, without a line of radishes going to seed (or not!).

Lastly, an observation from an unknown source:

"Gardening adds years to your life and life to your years."



NOTES FROM THE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 01 JUNE 2023

There was one member of the public present, who came along to listen to the meeting.

Dist Cllr Jones reported in the Public Forum:

There is a Warmer Homes Grant available to improve insulation in properties, this is not means tested and for the property not the person. There is to be a £7m investment in the Skegness Esplanade, this will be funded by the owners and ELDC to extend and improve the pier area.

There is a scrutiny committee in place to discuss the situation of the toilet facilities in East Lindsey, including the charges. Another scrutiny committee is looking at the use of Magna Vitae and PSPL for out sourced work, are they value for money? Carbon emissions are to be zero by 2030, more charging points for cars are required throughout the District. There are going to be another 100 wind turbines off shore in the area of The Wash.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported in the Public Forum:

Skegness has a Neighbourhood Development Plan. Parishes can use the format to do a Parish Neighbourhood Plan. It was suggested that the Parish Council should pay for this to be done, the District Council can help. It is very difficult for the Parish Council, with volunteers, to get a Plan in place.

The District Councillors left the meeting.
