Kiddies Corner

Yorkshire Parkin

Ingredients

- 200g unsalted butter
- 250g self-raising flour
- 100g oatmeal (or porridge oats blitzed in the blender)
- 80g soft brown sugar
- 200g golden syrup
- 80g black treacle
- 1 and ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon mixed spice
- 1 large egg
- 5 tablespoons milk



Method

- Preheat the oven to 160C (140C fan) or gas mark 3.
- Grease a traybake tray and line with baking paper.
- In a small bowl, beat the egg and milk with a fork.
- In a large pan, gently heat the syrup, treacle, sugar and butter until it's all melted and dissolved. Remove from heat.
- Add the oatmeal, flour and spices to the syrup mixture and mix well.
- Add the egg and milk mixture and stir until well combined.
- Put the mixture into the tin and bake for 40 60 minutes. Keep a close eye on the cake: it is ready when it's coming away from the sides, firm to touch and slightly crusty on top. Don't let it brown too much.
- Cool in the tin. It'll taste better if you keep it wrapped in foil and baking paper for a few days, but good luck resisting!



Gardening Tips for November:

At long last, the weather seems to be showing some signs of returning to normal values in temperature. There is even mention of the frost word in the forcasts. The days are definitely becoming shorter and it won't be long before the hour 'falls' back. Key tasks for this month are harvesting what we have already planted and preparing the garden to get off to a good start in the Spring. Here then, are a few jobs we can be thinking of as we await the onset of winter.

- 1) If you have Brussel sprouts, the green leaves at the stalk tops known, not surprisingly(!), as sprout tops, can be harvested, cooked and eaten like spring greens.
- 2) Again, if you have grown cauliflowers, use them as required; unless it is very cold, there is no hurry to harvest, as they will have stopped growing.
- 3) Beans intended for drying and their seeds stored for next year may be left on the plant until they have dried out completely, then picked and placed in a dry container.
- 4) Winter spinach varieties, which are fast growing and bred to tolerate shorter days, should crop this month. It may be necessary to provide protection in any severe weather.
- 5} If you grow any early sprouting broccoli, pick any remaining spears before the hardier types take over in the new year. (I think these are my favourite vegetable.)
- 6) Carrots can be lifted to eat or be stored although they can be left in the ground for the winter.
- 7} When digging up leeks, use a fork or you'll risk snapping off the stem.
- 8) Jobs for preparing for the new growing year include, removing all remaining plants that have finished cropping, taking down bean supports, weeding and digging and, of course, digging in manure and compost. The 'no-dig' advocates suggest spreading the manure on top of the soil and covering it with plastic sheeting, allowing worms to do the work.
- 9) Covering vegetable beds with polythene sheets or membrane over the soil will keep off the worst of the rain and suppress the weeds.

Well, that should be enough to be getting on with!

In conclusion, a quote from an unidentified source:



A MINUTES SILENCE WAS HELD TO MARK THE PASSING OF THE CHAIRMAN, MARGO BOLLAND

Before the meeting started Cllr Edwards was voted in as the new Chairman.

Present: Cllrs Pritchard, Roberts, Jones, Pocklington, Hopkins, Sherriff and Edwards (Chairman)

Apologies: Apologies were received from County Cllr Bowkett.

Also present: Dist Cllrs Ashton and Jones

Reports from representatives on outside bodies

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

Councillors Community Grants are still available, between them the District Councillors had £4000.00. It was resolved that £500.00 of the grant would be made available towards a defibrillator.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

Negotiations are still taking place with regard to devolution, the situation was outlined. ELDC will become financially comfortable with business rates being available for collection from Tritton Knoll and from Viking Link. The points scoring system for planning and development is being changed, for the better. There is a 'push' for the re-use and re-build of existing buildings rather than buildings being left to deteriorate and new buildings being put up in the same area. Special levies are being sought from Central Government with regard to Drainage Board Fees, a one-off payment was received, but this needs to be a regular payment. The Dist Councillors were asked about a local planning application. Should this be refused then the applicant can appeal. If the appeal is upheld then the application can go ahead. If the appeal is turned down then planning enforcement can start to do the necessary work they need to do. The applicant can only put in a second application. A question about planning to the north of the village was asked, Dist Cllr Ashton will look into this and report back to the Council.
