# Pancake Day - 13 February

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, <u>Anglo-Saxon</u> Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" and is still rung today.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year and falls between February 3 and March 9.

Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

The pancake has a very long history and featured in cookery books as far back as 1439. The tradition of tossing or flipping them is almost as old:

"And every man and maide doe take their turne, And tosse their Pancakes up for feare they burne." Pasquil's Palin

The ingredients for pancakes can be seen to symbolise four points of significance at this time of year:

Eggs ~ Creation Flour ~ The staff of life Salt ~ Wholesomeness Milk ~ Purity

# **Gardening Tips for February:**

Already there are signs of approaching Spring. Bulbs are pushing their heads up through the earth, wild life is waking up with increasing bird-song and activity and light levels and temperatures are increasing. Having said that, we are in a post-Christmas cold snap which is forecast to last another week or so, so any gardening activities must take into account that temperatures can go down as well as up. Here then are a few suggestions while we await the arrival of spring.

- 1) Chit first-early potatoes, by standing them in trays or empty egg-boxes, in a light, frost free place. Check on them to see that the chits are the right way up and can respond to the light.
- 2) Prepare vegetable beds for sowing by weeding thoroughly and cover with a layer of garden compost. If available, cloches could be used to heat up the soil.
- 3) Sow mustard and cress in a small seed tray on a warm windowsill for picking in just a few weeks.
- 4) It is a good idea to check on the viability of seeds left over from previous years by sowing a few seeds on damp kitchen paper to see if they germinate.
- 5} Birds are a great friend of the gardener so encourage their presence by feeding them regularly. By late winter, many natural sources are thinning out, so it is a good idea to offer a variety of foods to attract the widest selection of bird species. Robins will be down at your feet if you are doing any digging, sunflower seeds will attract a variety of species, while nyger seed is a favourite of finches.
- 6) If you are starting off seed sowing for early planting, read the seed packet to find out how many weeks it will take for your plants to develop into the ideal size for the garden, then count backwards from your last expected frost date, to get an accurate start date.

Finally, a word of wisdom from Ruth Stout, an American author best known for her 'No Work' gardening books and techniques:

'I love Spring anywhere but if I could choose, I would always greet it in a garden'.




