Gardening Tips for June:

Well, we are here now in what is termed 'flaming June' with a hot, sunshine filled month and all risk of frost having passed. This should enable us all to catch up with all those jobs we didn't get done when the weather was inclement. June 21st will be the Summer solstice with plenty of daylight to allow us to get on with things and also anticipate the rewards for our efforts in the coming harvest. So here are a few things to consider getting on with:

1} Keep on top of the weeds so keep that hoe moving: Check directly sown crops - carrots, parsnips, beetroots and spinach - and thin as necessary. Ensure carrots are safe from the marauding carrot-fly. These are active in April/May and again in July/August, so it is best to prepare for the 'second-coming'.

2} This can be a dry month so keep an eye on the need to water. Water copiously when you do. If the soil appears dry a quick check can be done by scratching under the surface by either scraping away with a trowel or pushing a finger in.

3) This can be a good month to plant out brassicas; broccoli, calabrese, Brussel sprouts and cabbage. Again ensure they get optimum start by watering them well in.

4) Continue sowing salad crops - beetroot, lettuce, Pak choi and radish. These leafy crops do better if sown in partially shady positions, since the hot dry weather can lead to bitter tasting leaves.

5) If you have started beans (runner and French) off in pots, they should go into their outside positions now. They will need well prepared ground and suitable supports for the shoots to twine around and grow upwards.

6} Leeks, the size of pencils, need to go into their final positions now. Apparently the received wisdom of trimming the leaves and roots when transplanting, is no longer considered to be good advice and of no benefit and can be counter-productive.

7} Keep an eye on the developing tomatoes in the greenhouse and pinch out the side shoots, at the same time keeping an eye out for pests such as aphids, whitefly and red spider mite. Outdoor tomatoes can go into their final position in mid to late June, as well. Give them the best chance when moving them from greenhouse to outdoors, by conditioning them to move by taking them out in the day and putting them back at night for a few days. Another idea is to move them from greenhouse to cold frame to garden plot.

Finally, a word of wisdom from W E Johns (I assume the same man who created Biggles - I can find no other)

'One of the most delightful things about the garden is the anticipation it provides!

Present: Cllrs Pritchard, Pocklington, Hopkins, Sherriff, Gray and Edwards (Chairman)

Also present: Dist Cllrs Ashton and Jones and four members of the public

Apologies: received from Cllr Jones and County Cllr Bowkett

Co-option of a new Councillor

Mr Burton attended the meeting and was co-opted onto the Parish Council

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

ELDC spend more money on coastal areas rather than in the villages, this is being looked into to try and share the money available. The Pride Team is available to 'book' via the ELDC website. A scrutiny panel will be looking into carbon production in East Lindsey. On 06 June the Lancaster has been booked for a fly over at Gypsy Bridge to commemorate D-Day.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

Investment in villages – the executive board has agreed to make more money available to Parish Councils, this will be in the form of loans available from £250,000 held at ELDC. Business rates of £620,000 received from Tritton Knoll will be used for to support grass roots schemes in the district. Everyone is opposed to the pylon scheme, work is ongoing to recognise the Fens as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

There is an existing development where a management fee is paid, residents in this area would then be paying for the maintenance of one Public Open Space and having to contribute, via the precept, to the maintenance of other Public Open Spaces. It will set a precedent for future developments in the Parish. It is not the position of the Parish Council to take on such responsibilities to help developer sell their properties. With these comments in mind it was resolved not to take on this responsibility.
