<u>Kiddies Corner</u>

Ingredients

1 aubergine
60g grated cheese
4 tbsp pizza sauce
1 tbsp olive oil

6 black olives, sliced
50g small pepperoni, sliced

<u>Method</u>

- 1. Slice the aubergine into 8-9 slices and place on a baking tray
- 2. Sprinkle with olive olive oil and salt, then bake on 220°C for 15 20 mins
- 3. Remove from oven and add the pizza sauce and cheese, with some olives on some and pepperoni slices on others
- 4. Bake for a further 6 mins, remove from oven and enjoy

Gardening Tips for July:

As I write we are still waiting for some real warmth. There is a cold wind that certainly does not encourage much gardening activity. However, perhaps by the time the Newsletter has been delivered, the sun will be shining out of a beautiful blue sky. It is difficult to think that in about ten days time from now, the days will start getting shorter. Oh joy!

Here are some jobs which could keep us busy as we enjoy the beginning of Summer.

1) Onions and Shallots are thirsty vegetables, so water them regularly to improve the size of the bulbs and to ensure a good flavour. Keep an eye on any that are forming little seed heads and pinch off, also for any rotting bulbs which should be binned immediately.

2} Weeds need as much, if not more, attention now. Longer daylight hours and showers will benefit their growth, so keep our old friend, the hoe, busy.

3} Tomato plants will be taking up a fair share of available time. Remove any side shoots, stop the plants when 4-5 trusses are evident by cutting off the main growing tip. Feed regularly with tomato food and keep an eye on the soil, maintaining a good level of watering.

4} Second early potatoes should be ready for harvesting. Gently lift one or two tubers to check on the size, and if they are found to be on the small size, leave them a bit longer. Remember to water if possible.

5} Carrot seeds, lettuce and leaf seeds and spinach can continue to be sown successively during the month. Beetroot and early sown carrots should be ready to be harvested by now.

6} Regular pickings of runner beans, French beans and courgettes will encourage further cropping. Keep a particular watch on courgettes which seem to be able to grow into marrow size overnight.

7} It is worth buying a few, specially treated, potato tubers for planting either in bags or buckets, for eating on Christmas Day. By planting them in containers, they can be taken into a sheltered spot when the frosts come.

In conclusion, some advice from William Kent:

'Garden as though you will live forever.'

Planning applications received

The Parish Council OBJECTED to the following planning application:

S/169/02506/23 - Steven Layn (Holdings) Ltd - Change of use and alterations of existing buildings to be used under class E, siting of 137 storage containers and erection of 13 micro commercial units, erection of security gates and fencing and hardstanding at The Caravan Centre, Station Business Park, Main Road.

The development is not in keeping with the aspect of open countryside in this area of the village and is next to a Nature Conservation Area. How many addition vehicles would be entering the site, it will be more of an industrial site with all the units suggested. Will the additional traffic impact on the adjacent Nature Conservation Area? The Public Footpath needs to be maintained and clear to walk at all times.
