Bonfire Guide

In order to avoid problems and possible legal action, it is recommended that you follow the checklist below:-

- Only burn dry material.
- > Never burn household rubbish, rubber tyres, or anything containing plastic, foam or paint.
- > Never use old engine oil, methylated spirits or petrol to light a bonfire or to 'encourage it'.
- Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the evening.
- > Avoid burning if the wind will take any smoke into neighbours gardens/houses and across roads.
- > Avoid burning at weekends and on bank holidays when people want to enjoy their gardens.
- Never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder.

Bonfires can be dangerous. Fire can spread to fences or buildings and scorch trees and plants.

Exploding bottles and cans are a hazard when rubbish is burned.

The Fire and Rescue Service will deal with bonfires if there is a risk to the safety of people or buildings.

Gardening Tips for November:

The weather has been very mixed of late, with the odd frost on one hand, and temperatures of 20 degrees on the other. We've had our fair share of rain too. The trees are beginning to look magnificent with their leaves displaying all manner of hues and colours. As we await the coming winter, with all its challenges, here are a few jobs to think about which will get us out into the fresh air.

1) Talking of leaves, if you have trees in your garden, then it's worthwhile clearing them and composting them. Leaf mould is worth its weight in gold, so well worth the extra work. Place them in a simple open frame of chicken wire or pack them into black bin bags. If possible sprinkle with garotta, and later pierce the bags with a fork, before moistening the leaves and moving the bags to a shady place for a year or so.

2) Get the greenhouse ready for winter by cleaning it inside and out. Check the panes of glass are intact and properly secured. Replace any broken panes of glass and make sure all water collecting systems and guttering are free from leaves.

3) A good indoor job is to save any abundant crops by freezing and/or making homemade soups. Dry or dehydrate fruits and vegetables and turn excess apples, tomatoes or beans into chutneys and pickles.

4) Tidy up the garden by maintaining good garden hygiene and so help to reduce the spread of overwintering diseases. Pick off infected foliage and other debris from the vegetable patch.

5) Get on top of the strawberry bed by removing any competing weeds and picking off faded foliage and old runners to improve air flow between plants, thus reducing the risk of pest and disease problems next year. Don't forget to replace any plants that are over three years old, by using small plants you have cultivated yourself from runners or by buying new ones. It is wise to pick a new bed if you are replanting new plants.

6) Birds do such a lot of good work in the garden that it is worthwhile encouraging their presence. They will start looking for nesting sites as early as January. Buy or make new boxes and put them up for wrens, sparrows and tits in autumn or early winter, ready for next year. You can, of course, encourage birds to enter the garden by providing food for them.

And in conclusion, a word of wisdom from Alice Sebold, the American author:

"I like gardening - it's a place where I find myself when I need to lose myself."

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 03 OCTOBER 2024

There were two members of the public present, together with County Cllr Bowkett and Dist Cllr Jones. There has been some damage to gravestones, flower vases and the chains in the cemetery – this will be reported to the Police. Dead birds have been found in the cemetery and in the picnic area, they have pellet holes in them – this will be reported to the Police (IF ANYONE SEES ANYTHING LIKE THIS PLEASE REPORT TO 101 as the incidents may be linked). Tractor drivers seen on the mobile phone whilst driving will be reported to the company they work for. The 30mph signs have been moved – they should be moved every six weeks. Good comments were made regarding the garden by the defibrillator, further work will take place at the entrance to the secondary school with the help of the pupils.

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest

<u>Reports from representatives on outside bodies</u> County Cllr Bowkett reported:

The puffin crossing will be installed from 14 October – delayed due to weather conditions. Three properties in Hall Lane have been affected by the recent heavy rain, this will be looked at by Anglian Water. Any property affected by sewerage in the garden should report it to County Cllr Bowkett or Anglian Water. The storm drains at Main Road and Horbling Lane will be 'flushed' again. The glass in the defibrillator box was broken by some LCC contractors who admitted this when it happened. This has been reported on Fix my Street and the report is that there will be no action taken – County Cllr Bowkett will look into this matter.

Dist CIIr Jones reported:

Folly Lane has been repaired. There is a £10m grant available via ELDC to revitalise villages. There is still some District Councillors grant available. The S106 agreements are being looked at to check that the money from the local developments is being given to the organisations they are for, schools and NHS. There will be elections in May for a Mayor for Lincolnshire.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

There is a vacancy on the Governance and Audit Committee at ELDC to be filled by co-option. The IDB's are not receiving agreed funding from the Environment Agency. This funding was discretionary not compulsory. The burger van in the village needs planning permission.
