<u>Kiddies Corner</u>

<u>Mini egg cookies</u>

Ingredients

- 100g caster sugar
- 100g light brown sugar
- 120g unsalted butter, melted
- 1 large free-range egg
- ½ tsp vanilla extract
- 300g gluten-free plain flour
- ¼ tsp xanthan gum
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 160g mini eggs, crushed
- 80g/3oz milk chocolate chips

<u>Method</u>

- 1. Mix the sugars with the melted butter in a large bowl.
- 2. Add the egg and vanilla extract and continue to mix until fully combined.
- 3. Mix in the gluten-free flour, xanthan gum, salt and bicarbonate of soda until combined.
- 4. Add the crushed mini eggs and chocolate chips and give them a good mix in so they are dispersed evenly.
- 5. Cover the bowl and place in the fridge for 45 minutes.
- 6. Preheat the oven to 190C/170C Fan/Gas 5 and line a couple of baking trays with non-stick baking paper.
- 7. Roll the chilled cookie dough into golf-size balls and place them onto the
- 8. prepared trays, leaving space between them for spreading. (If your trays are small, you may need to cook them in batches.)
- 9. Bake for 12–15 minutes until golden and flattened.
- 10. Remove from the oven and leave to cool for a few minutes on the baking tray before transferring to a cooling rack.

<u>Recipe tips</u>

You could use regular plain flour and omit the xanthan gum if you don't need these to be gluten-free.

You can freeze the uncooked dough in balls and bake whenever you fancy a mini egg cookie!

Gardening Tips for February:

As I look out of the window it is difficult to imagine any gardening being done anytime soon. The ground is covered in a sharp white frost and while we are promised a break in the weather this coming week, with a return to more average temperatures, the ground will be too cold to allow any germination of seeds. So perhaps it is best to concentrate our energy on any indoor tasks we could be getting on with while also considering planting shallots and onions as the ground becomes workable.

1} <u>Onions</u>. Often planted as sets (small immature bulbs that continue growing once planted) they can also be grown from seed. This makes them less prone to bolting later on in the summer and there's little risk of introducing white rot into the garden. Another benefit is, it is cheaper too! Sow around four to six seeds into a plug or pot and plant out later in clusters about 10 inches each way. Harvest the larger bulb in each cluster first, allowing the remainder to grow on.

2} <u>Shallots</u>. While they too can be started as seeds, it is better to plant as bulbs about 6 inches apart with just the tip showing. These can be planted from late winter.

3} <u>Garlic</u>. If you missed the autumn planting, don't worry. They can be planted outside, unless the soil is frozen. If it is, plant them into pots of potting mix, keep under cover and plant outside once the soil is workable.

4} <u>Broad Beans</u>. Start off in the greenhouse in toilet roll tubes filled with potting mix or root-trainers, if you have them. Keep them in the greenhouse, covering with a protective fleece if frost threatens. Plant them outside once the seedlings reach a couple of inches.

5} <u>Peas</u>. Again, they can be started off in the greenhouse or cold frame. Shield from the weather with sheets of spare glass. This will also keep the mice away.

6} <u>Lettuce</u>. Seeds can be started off in trays which should be kept in a warm place. (A window sill is ideal) then, when large enough to handle, transfer to pots or plugs prior to planting out later in the Spring.

In conclusion, a quote from H Jackson Brown Jnr, the American author who said:

"Remember that children, marriages and gardens, reflect the kind of care they get."

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 05 DECEMBER 2024

There were three members of the public present. The handyman will be asked as to the whereabouts of a key and to confirm what work he carries out in the Churchyard. The glass in the new notice board was discussed. It was confirmed that an alleyway would not appear when a new development is completed at the rear of the properties at Main Road. The application for 46 properties in the village has been refused by ELDC Planning Committee.

Apologies: received from Cllrs Gray and Jones, County Cllr Bowkett and Dist Cllrs Jones

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest

Reports from representatives on outside bodies County Cllr Bowkett reported by email:

The puffin crossing only needs the lines painting to finish the work. Other requested road marking will be carried out at a later date. Emergency Planning will be available from LCC. £52m had been released to local drainage boards who will work on flood prevention. The area outside the William Lovell Academy is owned by LCC. A STOP sign will not be sited at the Horbling Lane/A16 junction. 30mph repeater signs will not be sited along Horbling Lane. Issues regarding the slurry sealing of footways has been investigated by LCC. The boss of the workforce on the puffin crossing admitted they had caused the damage to the glass in the defibrillator box, this is now being looked at by LCC. **Dist Clir Ashton reported:**

The Government is changing the National Planning Policy Framework, this may mean that 655 new properties have to be built in East Lindsey each year – the current number is 450. The ELDC Local Plan up to 2031 will be deemed out of date should the NPPF change. ELDC currently have a 5 year supply of properties, this is adequate, but may have to change with any new plans. There has been no decision on planning at East Fen Lane. The height of a newly built wall at Main Road will be looked into.

OBJECTIONS were made to the following application:

S/169/02506/23 - Steven Layn (Holdings) Ltd - Change of use and alterations to existing buildings to be used under class E, siting of 133 storage containers and erection of 13 micro commercial units, lifting barrier, fencing and hardstanding at The Caravan Centre, Station Business Park, Main Road - *This development is in open countryside and previous objections will be reported again.*

SUPPORT was given for the following applications:

S/169/01735/24 – Nationalgrid - Form B application, Notification of proposed works to replace existing overhead line at Summer Heath Cottage, Main Road

S/169/01736/24 – Nationalgrid - Form B application, Notification of proposed works to replace existing overhead line at West Fen Meadows, West Fen Lane

S/203/01776/24 - Mr K Sharpe - Erection of a replacement workshop on the site of an existing workshop and storage container which are to be removed at Peewees Place, Hagnaby Lock

Planning Decisions received

There were no planning decisions for this meeting

The Chairman reported that the recent Christmas event in the Church was attended by around 100 people, again a great success for Stickney. The donations received were split between the Church and the Hundleby Community Choir with each getting £65.00 – thank you for these donations.

Improvements to Flood Warning Service – from the Environment Agency

We are making some improvements to the Flood Warning Service so that it more accurately reflects the risk of flooding around West Fen Catchwater, Stonebridge Drain and lower River Witham main rivers.

This means there will be 29 properties added to the 'West Fen Catchwater, Stonebridge Drain and lower River Witham' Flood Warning Area within your Parish. Through the **free** Flood Warning Service, we aim to let people know of any flooding from the main rivers and/or the sea that could affect their home. They can receive the warnings using their preferred combination of text message, mobile, landline and email options. To sign up to the Flood Warning Service people can go online **www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings** or call our **Floodline** directly on **0345 988 1188**.

The changes are happening as a result of information received from Storm Babet and elsewhere. If residents haven't had the opportunity to share this with us, we would still be grateful for any information and photos to show the date and time that any flooding affected their driveway, garden, garage/outbuildings and/or main property. We would also appreciate details about the depth and source of the flooding. Details can be sent to <u>frt.lincsandnorthants@environment-agency.gov.uk</u> We always review any Flood Warnings that are issued to see if any changes are needed for the future.
