# Kiddies Corner

## Tiffin – a treat to make for Mother's Day

### Ingredients

- 75g golden syrup
- 100g unsalted butter, diced
- 175g milk chocolate, roughly chopped
- 125g dark chocolate, roughly chopped
- 225g oat biscuits, such as digestives, crushed
- 100g malted milk balls, such as Maltesers
- 100g raisins, or other dried fruit



### Method

1. Line the base and sides of a 20cm/8in square cake tin with baking paper.
2. Combine the golden syrup, butter, milk chocolate and dark chocolate in a medium-large heat-proof bowl set over a pan of barely simmering water. Stir from time to time until the ingredients are nearly all melted and smooth. Remove from the heat, stir until smooth and leave to cool for 5 minutes.
3. Meanwhile, combine the crushed oat biscuits with the honeycomb-centred chocolate and raisins in a large mixing bowl. Pour the melted chocolate mixture into the bowl and mix to combine thoroughly. Scoop the mixture into the prepared tin and spread level using the back of a spoon. Chill for one hour until firm and then cut into portions to serve.

–The Irish flag is green, orange, and white.

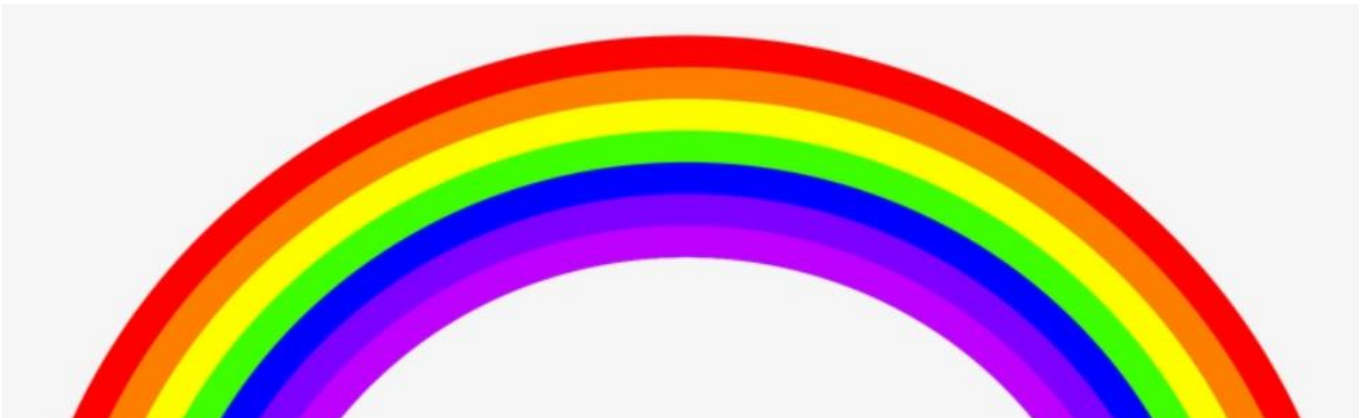
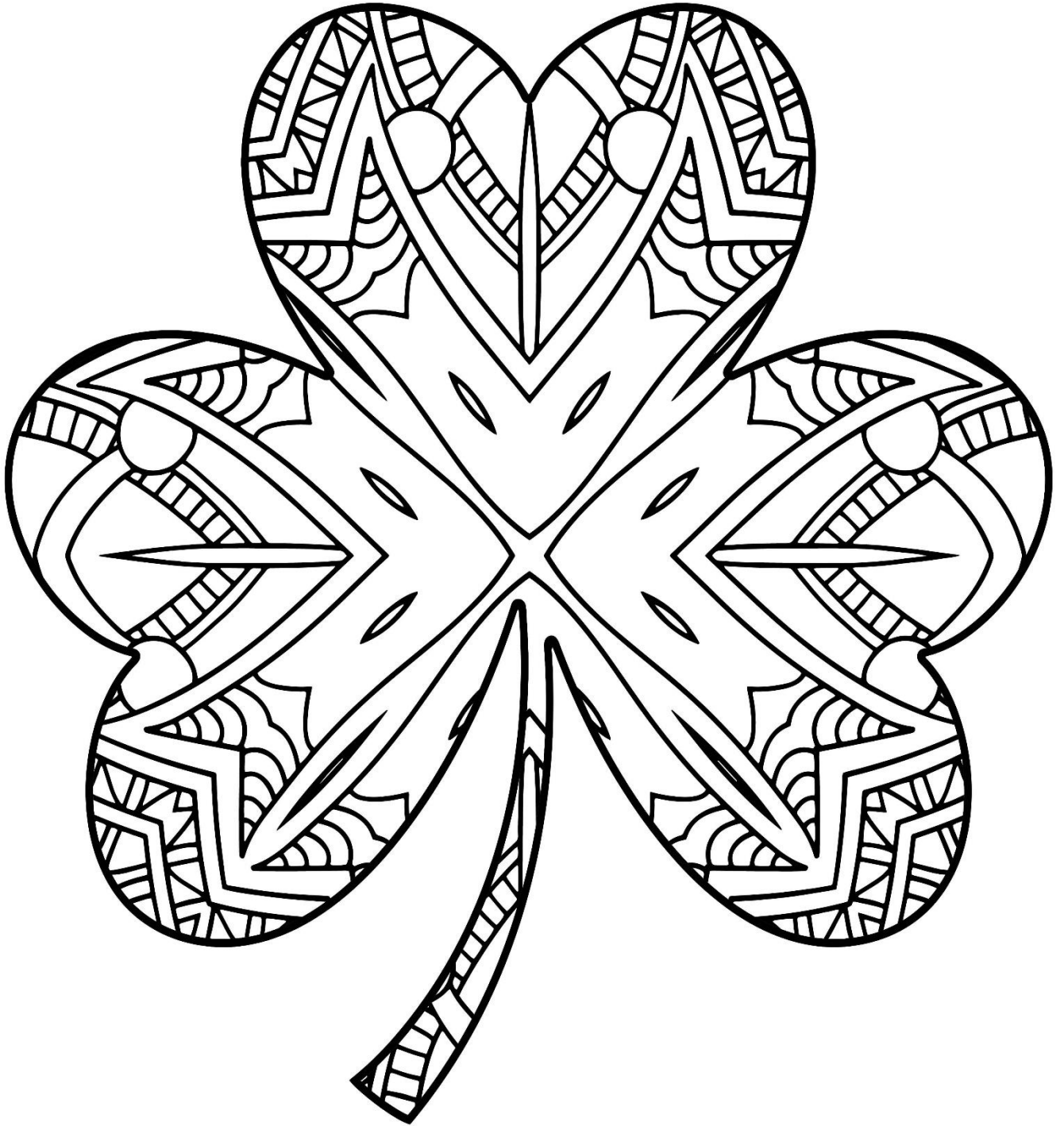
–Four-leaf clovers are considered lucky. Each leaf means something: hope, faith, love, and luck.

–The traditional symbols for St. Patrick's Day are the shamrock, leprechauns, green, a harp, the Celtic cross, and the Blarney Stone.

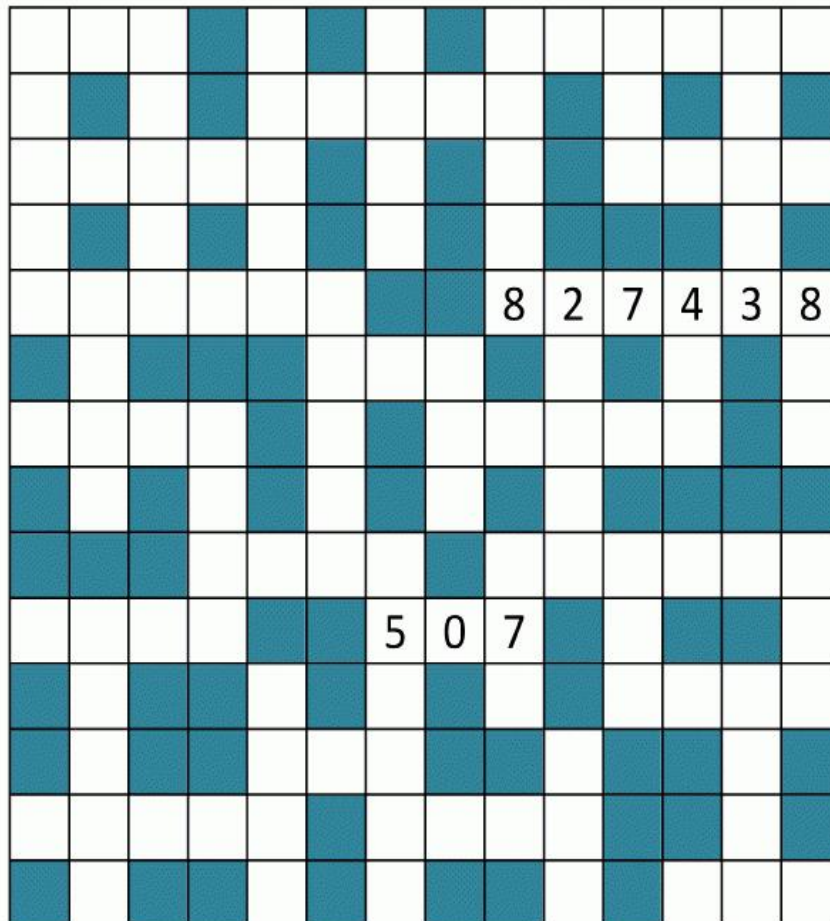


A picture to colour for St Patick's Day

## **Gardening Tips for March:**

Nearing mid-February and there's no sign or suggestion of Spring. Long grey damp days follow each other with just the tiniest note of optimism in the promise of temperatures reaching the dizzy heights of 11 degrees soon. However, March itself is supposed to be the busiest month of the year, although just how busy, depends on how much preparatory work has been done.

Whatever is sown this month, we must be aware of sudden vicious frosts and cold drying winds. Here then are a few suggestions for those brave hearted who feel the need to get sowing.

1} As the ground becomes warmer it is a good idea to prepare seed beds for sowing by ensuring they are weed free and raked to a fine tilth. Any protection is invaluable now so be prepared to use the greenhouse, cold frame or a row of cloches which can make all the difference between success and failure. Even a sheet of polythene or spun fleece stretched over a seed bed will shield seeds from degrees of frost.

2} Start preparing runner bean supports and trenches for sowing (in May), or planting out in June. Trenches can be dug into which vegetable matter can be placed and then covered over prior to planting.

3} Avoid digging in wet weather but if gardening on wet soil, it is best to work from a plank of wood to avoid treading on the bed and compacting the soil.

4} In late February/early March, start cabbages, kale, broccoli, cauliflower, onion, leeks and lettuce indoors.

5} In late March, sow peas, spinach and start off peppers, tomatoes and Swiss Chard indoors.

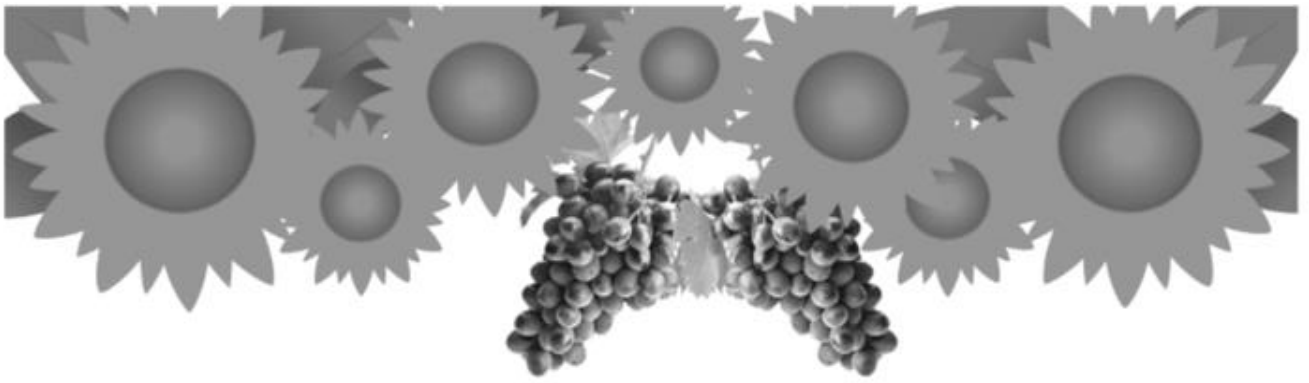
6} Time now to plant out those well-chitted early potatoes, either in containers (a very versatile way) or in the ground. Keep an eye out for frost affecting any early greenery.

7} Plant strawberries in a hanging basket to keep away from slugs.

Finally, and in conclusion, a quote from Ruth Stout, an American author:

**"I love Spring anywhere,  
but if I could choose,  
I would always greet it in a garden."**

## **NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 06 FEBRUARY 2025**

There were four members of the public present, together with Dist Cllrs Ashton and Jones. Issues in the cemetery were reported, the path, moles and a loose post. There has been no news on the planning application for a travellers site. A weight limit on Hall Lane to protect Medlam bridge will be looked into by Cllr Ashton. Speeding is still an issue in Horbling Lane. Issues reported in the picnic area will be passed onto the relevant authority. A manhole in the A16 has still not been repaired.

**Present:** Cllrs Pocklington, Hopkins, Burton, Sherriff, Pritchard, Jones and Edwards (Chairman)

**Apologies:** received from Cllr Gray and County Cllr Bowkett

### **Declarations of Interest**

There were no declarations of interest

### **County Cllr Bowkett reported by email:**

The County Council elections will go ahead in 01 May alongside the Mayoral Election for Greater Lincolnshire. LCC will set an increase of 2.99% to its section of the Council Tax. The net budget for 2025/26 is £690m. Following the storm on 06 January 65mm of rain fell in a short period of time causing many flooding events. Over 100 properties reported internal flooding, one of which was in Stickney. Anglian Water are working to protect Hall Lane residents from flooding. Highways officers will visit Stickney to have a look at the drainage situation.

### **Dist Cllr Jones reported:**

Planning for 86 houses in Sibsey has been approved, a percentage of the s106 money will be given to Stickney Surgery. ELDC have a Grassroots loan available, this amounts to £29,000 per village. Express Care will look for volunteers to help individuals in the village. The £10m EL Investment – grants are now available. Speed signs will be considered with this grant. Flooding at the entrance to the picnic area should be reported to LCC.

### **Dist Cllr Ashton reported:**

The Government has suggested that ELDC should increase the housing supply by 150% more than is currently in the Local Plan. The Local Plan will need to be changed, removing two tier Councils will also have a big effect on any Local Plan. Parish Councils will not be affected by these changes.

### **Freedom of information response regarding the s106 agreements**

ELDC reported that no S106 monies have been received with regard to any of the developments in Stickney since 1990. This means that no monies have been available to the schools or the surgery. This information will be passed to Dist Cllr Jones to follow up.

The Pride Team do not take away the grass they remove from the footways, they will be asked to do this. Parking in the layby is an issue again as is parking on the grass verges at Main Road.
