Kiddies Corner

Three Ingredient Brownies

Ingredients

- 400 g jar of any chocolate spread
- 4 3 medium eggs, beaten
- 4 115 g plain flour



Directions

- ✓ Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan) mark 4
- ✓ Line a 20.5cm square cake tin with baking parchment.
- ✓ Put chocolate spread into a bowl and mix in the eggs with a wooden spoon, until the mixture is combined and glossy.
- ✓ Mix in flour, then pour into the lined tin and smooth to level.
- ✓ Bake for 15-18min, until just set and slightly springy to the touch.
- ✓ Cool completely in tin before slicing and serving.

Yogurt Parfait




Make a chocolatey breakfast or lunch by layering brownie pieces with yogurt.

Place a piece of brownie in the bottom of a tall glass then add a scoop of yogurt. Add another brownie and then some more yogurt. Continue the layering until the glass is full. You can also layer in some fresh berries, a few chopped nuts or even extra chocolate chips.

Brownie Cookies

Take those leftover brownies and make them into brownie cookies with this very easy trick.

- Mash the brownies together using a stand mixer. Let them really come together in a solid dough. If your brownies are a little dry, add a splash of milk.
- ➤ Once the brownies have formed a nice dough that is malleable, roll in into a log, wrap it and chill in the fridge for about 2 hours.
- > Take the log out and slice in into rounds.
- > Tada! Brownie cookies! Set them on a plate and serve!







NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 05 JUNE 2025

There were six members of the public present, together with Dist Cllr Jones. Residents attended to meet and ask questions of County Cllr Hume who was due to attend the meeting. Residents asked about planning issues to the rear of properties at Main Road and who is responsible for the maintenance of existing adjoining fencing – advice was to contact ELDC regarding any issues.

County Cllr Hume arrived along with a member of the public. Residents spoke to County Cllr Hume who answered questions and gave advice where appropriate. Speeding being one of the main issues. Dist Cllr Ashton arrived and answered residents questions regarding planning issues. The public left the meeting.

<u>Present</u>: Cllrs Pocklington, Hopkins, Burton, Pritchard, Gray, Sherriff and Jones (Chairman)

Apologies: received from Cllr Edwards

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest

County Cllr Hume reported

Speeding issues have been raised with the LRSP and further questions will be asked of them. Slurry sealing of the footways at Horbling Lane has been questioned. LCC will arrange a weed spray on the existing worked footway and the second footway is due a full reconstruction in this financial year. LCC report that the glass in the defibrillator box has been replaced. This will be checked as Councillors are sure it has not been done. Investigations need to be carried out regarding the possibility of a cycle route to Stickney from both Sibsey Northlands and Stickford. An Environment Scrutiny Committee will replace the LCC Flooding Committee and hold more meetings each year. All previous flooding committee work will continue with quarterly reports to be received from all agencies involved with flooding issues. District representatives will be invited to meetings to give more local knowledge of any flooding issues as they arise.

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

All households will be provided with an indoor food recycling caddy which, when full, will be emptied into the outdoor food recycling bin. The outdoor bin is about half the size of a normal waste bin. This will be rolled out before March 2026. Elif grants of up to £25,000 and Councillor Community Grants are still available. A car park scrutiny committee has been set up at ELDC – if anyone has issues with ELDC carparks please advise Dist Cllr Jones. Plans have been passed for four pods to be sited in Skegness for homeless people to use for one night to sleep and wash. The appeal for 46 properties at Stickney Meadows has been dismissed by the Planning Inspectorate.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

The Government housing target for ELDC is 150% more than what is in the existing Local Plan, this is not viable for East Lindsey at this time. No work is being done to update the Local Plan at this time as ELDC are awaiting the Government rulings. A Neighbourhood Plan should still be done as it should still affect the ELDC Local Plan. There is a new Market Policy where stall holders now receive a 50% reduction in the fees charged. The Government paid a 1 off grant levy payment to the drainage boards. The grant has to be applied for each year. It is hoped that Natural England will recognise areas of Boston and South Holland as Areas of Natural Beauty to prevent future pylon schemes across the area. Due to the Local Government re-organisation some areas will be cancelling local elections. The grant application sent is in hand.

Replacement of the bench at the Hall Lane/Main Road junction

The damaged bench will be removed. A decision whether to replace it or not will be made at the next meeting – if anyone has any comments regarding this decision please email them to the Clerk.

Community Speed Watch

Six new 30mph signs are to be delivered for Stickney. The CSW group at Sibsey have been asked if volunteers from Stickney can join them and if they would consider 'sharing' equipment – a response is awaited from the Co-ordinator.

To discuss interactive speed signs

The suppliers who have previously quote for these signs are no longer supplying interactive speed signs, therefore new suppliers have been sought. A decision regarding the number of signs required for Stickney will be made at the next meeting.

Any other highways issues

Cars parking on the grass verges is an issue in the village. Hedges overhanging the footways in the village need to be cut back. These will be reported on Fix my Street for LCC to deal with.

Planters at Willliam Lovell Academy

A meeting was held with LCC and representatives from the school to discuss the project. The 'garden' area to be used was approved as long as the mains water and water meter for the school were not near to the digging work to be carried out. A plan of the work was requested from the school and will be sent to the Parish Council, this has not yet been received.

New litter bins will be sought for the play area.

<u>District Councillor Community Grants – Parish Council applications</u>

A grant application was approved by Dist Cllr Jones for £500.00 towards a laptop and software for the work of the Parish Council. A grant application was approved by Dist Cllr Ashton for £350.00 for new Christmas lighting for 2025. This lighting is specifically for outdoor use and can be added to if required.

Elif grant application

The Parish Council will fund this project by 20% of the cost. Nothing has been heard from the grant funder.

Cycle route from Stickford to Sibsey Northlands

This was covered in County Cllr Hume's report, the paperwork will be looked at in more detail ready for discussion at the next meeting. Consultation with local residents may be required. The Parish Council will not be responsible to checking if there are any utilities along the footpaths, or for paying for the cycle route.
