Kiddies Corner

PUMPKIN SPICE SCONES

Ingredients

- 450g self-raising flour, plus extra for rolling
- 100g cold butter
- 50g golden caster sugar
- 1-2 tsp pumpkin spice
(or mix ½ tsp cinnamon, ¼ tsp ginger, a good grind of nutmeg and a pinch of allspice)
- 200g cooked pumpkin
- 80-100ml milk
- butter or cream cheese flavoured with a pinch of cinnamon, to serve



Method

1. Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7.
2. Put the flour in a bowl and coarsely grate in the butter (dipping the butter into the flour can make it easier to grate; do this as often as you need). Use a butter knife to stir the butter into the flour, then mix in the sugar and spice.
3. Add the pumpkin and 80ml milk to the flour mixture and quickly stir everything together. Add more milk if you need to.
4. Tip the mixture onto a floured surface and lightly bring together with your hands a couple of times.
5. Roll out until 4cm thick and cut out rounds with a 7cm cutter. Re-shape the trimmings and repeat until all the dough has been used.
6. Place the rounds on a lightly floured baking sheet and brush the tops with any remaining milk. Bake for 10-12 mins until risen and lightly browned.
7. Serve with the butter or the cinnamon infused cream cheese.

A good way to use up some pumpkin when making lanterns.

Be aware of who knocks on your door

Criminals target our homes to exploit us for money – they may knock at our doors and offer to sell us goods or do a maintenance job quickly for us. 92% of Brits say 'yes' at their door to avoid seeming rude by saying 'no'.

Most sellers do not call door-to-door selling products or services. Often, those selling on our doorstep will have an emotional story or urgent reason why we should buy from them. If someone is trying to convince us to buy goods on our doorstep is a good indicator that it may be suspicious.

Stop! Think Fraud

It's best to take time to do our own research and buy things when we want to. Keep control of your door, only answer to people you know or people you were expecting. When a stranger knocks on your door, sometimes it's hard to know if they are who they say, especially if they say they're a tradesperson or working on behalf of a charity.

When someone knocks at your door and doesn't feel right, STOP!

Break the contact with them- say no thank you and close the door.

If they ask you for money or personal details such as bank details, then say no, as you shouldn't pay for goods you haven't received or work that hasn't been done. Never let a cold caller pressure you into making decisions- any trader that is legitimate will be more than happy to return at a later date. If you are unsure, ask a friend or neighbour if they know the company or you can always enquire with trading standards.

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 04 SEPTEMBER 2025

There were six members of the public present, together with Dist Cllr Ashton. Residents reported issues at the Picnic Area and were advised to call 101 to report to Police. This will be brought up at the Teams meeting with the Police later in the month. The Parish Council records have been left with the History Group, thanks were expressed for this.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

The Government reorganisation for Lincolnshire is being looked at with five of the bids being more meaningful for Lincolnshire than others, but each of the five also need to be changed slightly to suit the whole of the County.

A large building in the village will be looked at with regard to planning permission granted.

Dist Cllr Ashton and all members of the public left the meeting

Apologies: received from Cllr Edwards

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest

County Cllr Hume was not present although she is wanting to carry out Community Engagement, contact details for the halls and information about the weekly coffee mornings has been passed to her along with a Parish magazine.

Dist Cllr Jones was not present but asked that residents be reminded to re-register to be on the electoral roll, this can be done online at e-lindsey.gov.uk

Replacement of the bench at the Hall Lane/Main Road junction

The bench will not be replaced at this time.

Planning applications received

OBJECTIONS were made to the following planning application:

02589/25/OUT - Mr M Houlden - Outline erection of 9 dwellings (with means of access to be considered at The Forge, Main Road

The accesses to this site are through a lay-by which will reduce the size of the much used lay-by, visitors to the surgery, the schools, Speedy's café and the burger van use this lay-by as there is nowhere else to park off the A16 when the school and surgery carparks are full. There is a problem with poor land drainage in this area of the A16. The property is significant in the history of Stickney, being one of the older properties in this area of the village – where the old blacksmiths was sited. Some of the trees have been removed and reduced the wildlife that was on the land. The plans show 9 large family properties with parking for only 10 vehicles. These family properties will put additional strain on the already over-stretched surgery.

Planning Decisions received

FULL planning permission has been received for:

02386/25/RVC - Clarke Construction Group - Section 73 application to vary conditions 2 (approved plans), 4 (vehicular and pedestrian access) and 6 (surface water) previously imposed on planning permission S/169/01314/21 for the erection of 9 dwellings at land adjacent to Perivale, Main Road

02217/25/FUL - Mrs P Dray - Extensions and alterations to existing dwelling to provide additional living accommodation at Coates Cottage, Thorndales Lane

REFUSAL of planning permission has been received for:

S/169/00336/25 - Steven Layn (Holdings) Ltd - Section 73 application to remove conditions no.6 (use), no. 13 (vehicles & machinery), no. 14 (operating times), no. 15 (subdivision) and to vary conditions no. 4 (landscaping) and no.7 (scope of e) previously imposed on planning permission ref. no. N/105/02506/23 for the change of use and alterations of existing buildings to be used under class E, siting of 136 No. storage containers and erection of 13 No. micro commercial units to be used under class E, erection of lifting barrier and fencing and construction of hardstanding at The Caravan Centre, Station Business Park, Main Road

An **Appeal** has been **DISMISSED** against an Enforcement Notice served on the owner of Land at Stickney Showground, East Fen Lane.

An **Enforcement Notice** has been issued: 'without planning permission, erection of a brick wall exceeding 1 metre in height above ground level adjacent to a highway' which should be complied with no later than 06 December 2025. An appeal can be made against this Notice.

Highways:

Speed checks can be carried out by residents who have been on a training course with the LRSP and the PCSO.

Confirmation was requested by LCC that the planters would be wooden, this has now been sent and the licence should not be long in being authorised.

Elif grant application

The Parish Council were turned down for the grant for the work in the cemetery, this is because the work can be paid for from the precept. Quotes will be sought for some of the more urgent work.

Play Area

New litter bins will be sought for the play area. An inspection was carried out in July, there were no issues with the equipment to report.
