Kiddies Corner

Easy Cheese and Chive Scones

Ingredients

- pinch of salt
- 1 tsp mustard powder
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 225g self-raising flour, plus extra for dusting
- 55g unsalted butter, chilled and cut into cubes
- 120g oz cheddar, grated
- 1 tbsp freshly chopped chives
- 100ml cold milk, plus extra for glazing



Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6. Line a large baking sheet with baking paper.
2. Sieve the salt, mustard powder, baking powder and flour into a bowl.
3. Add the butter to the flour mixture. Using your fingertips, lightly rub in the butter until you get a fine breadcrumb consistency.
4. Add 100g of the grated cheese into the flour mixture, and rub it in lightly. Save the remaining cheese for later. Add the chives and mix in.
5. Make a well in the centre of the mixture and add the cold milk a little at a time, mixing between each addition until the dough starts to come together. You may not need all the milk, don't add too much, it should be a crumbly dough-like consistency.
6. Tip the mixture onto a lightly floured surface and bring it together into a ball using your hands. Shape it into a 2cm thick disc using your hands (alternatively use a rolling pin). Don't roll the dough too thinly or you will end up with crunchy biscuits instead of fluffy scones.
7. Using a medium-sized cutter (about 4–5cm diameter) cut the dough into circles, using one sharp tap and not twisting the dough as you cut.
8. Place the scones on the lined baking sheet and repeat until you have used all the dough.
9. Brush a little milk on the top of the scones using a pastry brush. Sprinkle with the leftover cheese.
10. Bake the scones for about 12 minutes, or until they are golden-brown. Allow to cool slightly on a wire rack and serve slightly warm. You know you've made a good scone if it tears easily!

1. The Show will take place at the Stickney Village Hall on Sunday 6th September 2026.
2. All Exhibits must be in place and ready for judging by 10.45 am. No time concessions will be allowed.
3. No Exhibit to be taken away before 4.00 pm. Any Exhibits not removed will be donated to The Old Rectory Assisted Living Residence in Stickney.
4. The Club or any member of the Committee WILL NOT be responsible for any loss or damage to Exhibits at any time.
5. 'Child' is defined as 16 years and under as of the Show Date for the purposes of exhibiting at this Show.
6. The maximum size and quantity of each Exhibit is noted at each section and class required.
7. All points and prizes awarded are listed in this schedule.
8. The Exhibitor will be responsible for providing any stand, vase, pot or any other accessory required for their own display.
9. All the Exhibits must be grown or made by the Exhibitor.
10. All class entries must be paid for when submitted. There will be no concessions.
11. A maximum of two Exhibits per class will be allowed per person. There will be no concessions.
12. All Exhibits must be clean and suitable to show. Any Exhibit considered not clean or suitable will be disqualified.
13. The last day for entries will be Saturday 29th August 2026.
14. Late entries will not be accepted under any circumstances.
15. If for any reason your Exhibit is not shown on the day even if entry fee paid there will be no refund given.
16. Any objections must be given to the Show Secretary by 2.00pm on the day of the show.

17. Whilst every effort will be made to ensure your entries are in the correct place and with the correct display details, the Show Committee cannot be responsible for any missing or misplaced items.
18. Under all circumstances concerning the Exhibits the Judge's decision will be final.
19. All Trophies, Cups, Salvers and Shields must be returned to the Club by Tuesday 24th August 2027.
20. Trophies, Cups, Salvers and Shields may be engraved with winner's name and '2026' at the Club's expense.

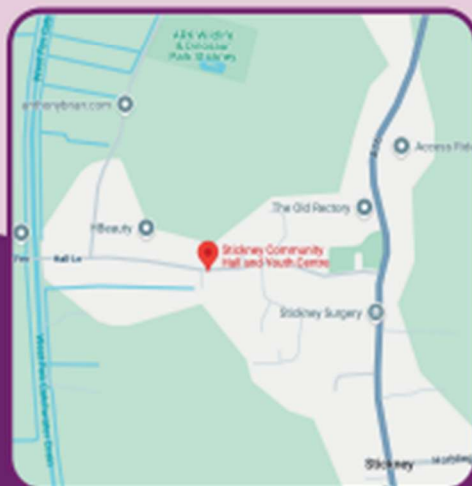

Reports from representatives on outside bodies

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

ELDC have spent £1.10m on the purchase of some woodland to preserve it. Horncastle Festival of the Wolds will be held on 16 May. There are digital skill 'drop in's' taking place in various areas – details are on the ELDC website. The Ageing Well Team at ELDC want ambassadors for people over 50 years of age. Grants are available from the Orsted Windfarm between £1000 and £50,000, these are for community groups and for Parish Councils. Councillor grants are available again this year, each Dist Councillor has £4000 to spend in their area. The County Councillors have a grant of £3000 to be spent in their area. The decision for councils all joining into one or two councils will be made by 19 July 2026.

Medlam Bridge has been reported as repaired, but the work done was not as reported, this will be reported again on Fix my Street.
