ROASTED PUMPKIN BITES – A use for the Pumpkin!

INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 lbs fresh pumpkin, peeled, seeded and cut into 1/2 inch cubes
2 garlic cloves, minced
1 tablespoon herbes de provence
1 tablespoon chili powder
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon cumin
1/2 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
4 tablespoons olive oil



- Preheat the oven to 450°F.
- Spray an oven proof baking dish with non-stick cooking spray (or you can butter the baking dish if you prefer).
- In a bowl, mix the garlic, Herbs de Provence, chili powder, cinnamon, cumin, Balsamic vinegar and olive oil.
- Add the pumpkin and toss well to coat.
- Set pumpkin in the baking dish.
- Place baking dish in the centre of a pre-warmed oven 20-25 minutes; after 10 minutes coat the pumpkin with any additional coating left in the bowl.
- Once roasted, pierce with cocktail sticks and serve.

CHRISTMAS GIFTS FROM STICKNEY CHARITIES

These Christmas Gifts of money are awarded as part of a historic custom of gifting milk or coal to residents in the village of Stickney over the last 100 years and more.

Over past years the amount of the gift has been pre-determined and restricted to a specific number of people as recognised by the Board of Trustees. Although the amount of money set aside for Christmas gifts has not changed the Trustees have decided to try a different approach for 2018. This year there will be no limit on the number of recipients but the amount of money for the Christmas gift will vary according to the number of people who apply.

Although the Trustees have been able to set some of the criteria for applying, they are bound by the Governing Documents of the Charities and are not in a position to make any changes. A good example of this is that it is specified that only widows and spinsters are eligible, whereas if the documents had been drawn up now this would not be acceptable!

Gardening Tips for October:

Re-reading my notes for October 2015, I noted that the migrant birds were all gathering ready for their long journey south. This year the swallows and swifts seem to have deserted us. I don't like being a harbinger of doom, but I do hope it is not another sign of the changes brought on by global warming.

For all that, winter is still some time away and the days of an 'Indian Summer' are ideal to engage in general pruning or tidying, as well as exploring the increasing range of crops which are available for us to sow in order for them to grow as the days become shorter.

Here then are a few jobs we could be getting on with:

1} Plant onions, shallots and garlic: Sow onion sets for an early crop in late September to October. Look out for 'Centurion', 'Hylander', 'Santero' or 'Sturon'. Shallots can be put out in well-drained soil from November.

Overwintering Shallots include 'Golden Gourmet' and 'Matilda'. Garlic needs a long growing season and benefit from a cold period below 10°C or 50°F. Consider growing the cloves in modules during winter, place in a cold frame and plant out in Spring.

2} Lettuce can be sown if the right variety are chosen, 'Winter Density' and 'Marvel of Four Seasons' should be considered, the former being a semi-cos variety producing crunchy salad leaves or can be used in stir fries, the latter, a butterhead with great colour, flavour and texture. They can be used as a cut-and-come-again when young and will mature into beautifully formed plants.

3} If you like a bit of spice in your salads try Rocket, 'Wasabi' which has the flavour of 'Japanese Horseradish'.

4} Now is the time to sow Salad Onions. 'White Lisbon' a winter hardy relative of the summer spring onion, which is tough enough to withstand the winter outdoors.

5} Support brassicas by drawing soil around their bases and by tying canes to support Brussel sprouts or purple sprouting broccoli. Remove the lower yellowing leaves to encourage their exposure to air and reduce the presence of white fly.

6}. If you are growing young chard, brassicas, parsnips or other winter crops you will be rewarded for sure for some TLC by drenching them in liquid fertiliser.

In conclusion, a quote I read recently in a gardening book:

**"I like gardening - it's a place where I find myself
when I need to lose myself."**

Action Fraud has received reports about a scam in which fraudsters target people with offers of “low cost” loans or “free” government grants. What the victims aren’t told is that the money they’ll receive is actually an advance payment of Universal Credit. The criminals use the personal information, they obtain under false pretences, to make an application for the loan in the victim’s name. After the criminals have taken their “fee” from the loan, the victim is then left to pay back the total amount when their repayments begin.

How you can protect yourself:

- **Never** share your personal, or financial, information with someone you don’t know and trust, especially if it’s in response to an offer of “free money” or a “free grant”.
- Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) staff will never approach you in the street or ask for your personal/financial details over social media.
- If you have concerns about your benefits, you should visit: www.gov.uk/contact-jobcentre-plus
- If you suspect your identity may have been stolen, you can check your credit rating quickly and easily online. You should do this every few months anyway, using a reputable service provider, and always follow up on any unexpected or suspicious results.

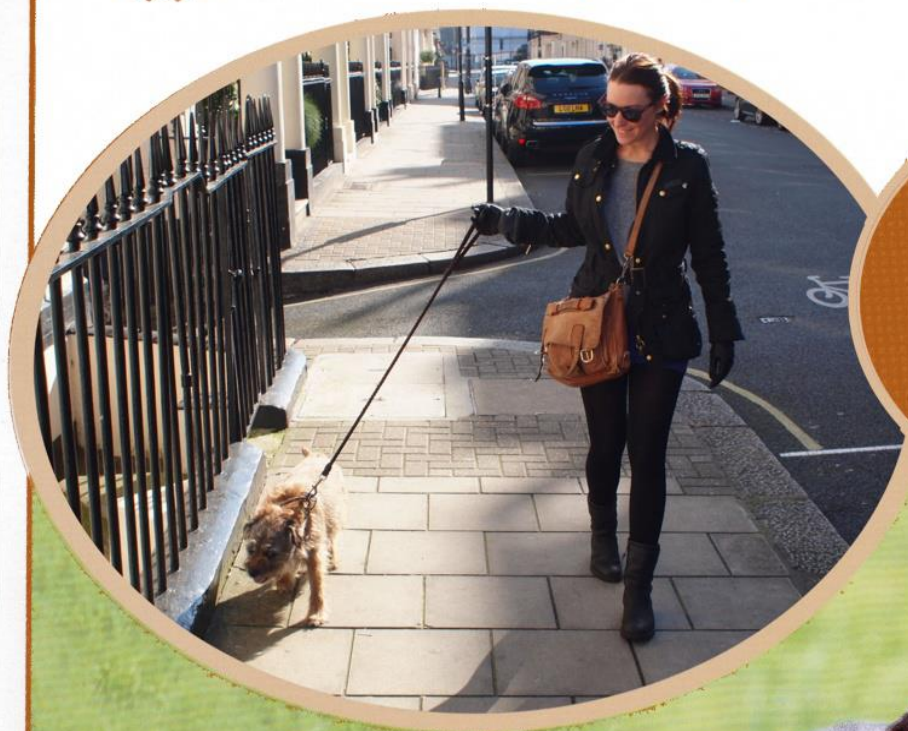
Angela will be missed, not only by the friends and acquaintances in Stickney, but also those in the surrounding villages where Angela supported groups and made friends.

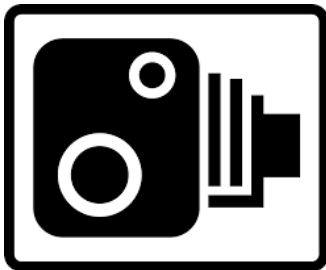

FINAL CHANCE FOR THOSE WHO DO NOT LIKE TRAFFIC SPEEDING THROUGH THE VILLAGE

Stickney Community Speed Watch – Co-ordinator required



Stickney was one of the first villages to set up a Community Speed Watch. At the beginning of the scheme speeds of up to 70mph in a 30mph area were recorded, now, the fastest 'speeders' are in the 40's. Although we haven't cured the problem of speeding vehicles in the village, we are well on the way to educating people to adjust their speeds and mind sets.

The scheme has some volunteers, but no one is available to take on the role of the Coordinator.

I'd like to explain what the role involves, to try and encourage someone to take on this role:

- ✓ The Coordinator is the person that keeps the equipment safe at their house.
- ✓ They arrange a team of 3 people to carry out a monitoring session at the road side, but DON'T have to take part themselves.
- ✓ They can, if they want to, enter the details of the recorded vehicles onto a spreadsheet to email for the letters to be sent, again they DO NOT have to do this, any team member can do it.

Training will be available from the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership
