Shrove Tuesday

The word *shrove* is a form of the English word *shrive*, which means to obtain absolution for one's sins by way of Confession and doing penance. Thus Shrove Tuesday was named after the custom of Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent.

In the United Kingdom, Ireland and parts of the Commonwealth, Shrove Tuesday is also known as "Pancake Day" or "Pancake Tuesday", as it became a traditional custom to eat pancakes as a meal before the start of Lent. The day has also been called "Mardi Gras", meaning "Fat Tuesday", after the type of celebratory meal that day.

Community Committee News – Car Park Appeal

It is with immense pleasure that we are now able to tell you that the total amount needed, to reach the target for the Car Park Appeal, has been achieved. This is great news for those who have done a lot of fund-raising events for this appeal.

Here is how the final amount were achieved:

We are very grateful for the generous donation of £500.00 from the Stickney Short Mat Bowls Club, and the Luncheon Club members who raised £150.00 through a raffle of a Christmas cake donated by Olywn. Finally, the remaining £9344.00, needed to complete the project, was awarded by Triton Knoll Offshore Wind Farm Community Fund in the form of a grant (thank you to Stickney Parish Council for letting us know about the grant). We are extremely grateful to Triton Knoll and our thanks also go to **everyone** that has attended our events, given donations of any kind and to those who have helped at the events – it has been hard work at times, but worth it in the end – THANK YOU!

When the weather improves the re-surfacing will be carried out with new tarmac and painted disabled parking bays.

The Improvement's will help improve the look of both halls and hopefully they will be more frequently used. It is currently used by with the Mobile Post Office twice weekly, the Library Van and the Mobile Medical Units from the surgery. Parents will be able to safely use the car park to drop off children for school, just having a short walk along Hall Lane – this would help traffic congestion and give both parents and children a short, healthy walk in the morning and evening.

Gardening Tips for February:

There is a noticeable change in the garden in February, although sometimes the change needn't necessarily be for the better. I've got a feeling that there's still a sting in the tail this winter and we could be in for a cold snap. However signs of spring are abundant with birds singing, bulbs emerging and there is a nice stretch in the evening. Here then are some jobs we could be thinking about as we await the warmer and sunnier days ahead.

- 1. Get seed beds ready now by breaking down any large clumps and covering the soil with fleece, polythene or cloches to warm up the soil prior to sowing in the coming months.
- 2. I've got myself a box and divided it into sections into which I've put my seed packets by the month they need to be sown. I was pleased with the results from my shallots grown by seed and intend to repeat the process.
- 3. Sort out the shed (Note to Self!!) and check your tools for anything that needs sharpening or a bit of T.L.C.
- 4. Have a look for those perennial weeds (dandelions, plantains for example) and dig them out root and all. This will pay future dividends. Fork in well rotted manure or garden compost.
- 5. R.H.S. really recommend the practice of chitting early potatoes and reckon the results are worth the effort. Stand them up on end (with 'eyes' pointing upwards) in a module tray or in old egg boxes and then place them in a bright place.
- 6. If you still have brassicas growing it is a good idea to remove any yellowing leaves. This will prevent brassica downy mildew and grey mould from spreading.
- 7. Those with autumn-fruiting raspberries should note that now is the last chance to cut the canes to the ground to stimulate new canes to fruit in the Autumn.
- 8. Keep feeding the birds.
- Finally a cardinal rule: only work in the garden if the weather is good.Tramping on soggy soil will only compact it and make future sowing difficult.

Finally a little funny I saw in a Garden Centre, which I think is worth sharing:

"Spring is here! I'm so excited I've wet my plants."
