
NOVEMBER 2019

Gardening Tips for November:

Here we are in late Autumn wondering yet again where the year has gone to. Already we have had some really foul weather, leaving the gardeners with a real problem in getting the last crops in before the weather deteriorates in earnest. As I write we are waiting to see the what effect the hurricane Lorenzo is going to have upon us. So as we wait, here are some late Autumn jobs we could be thinking about tackling.

1} Now is a good time to plant, lift and divide rhubarb. Make sure you clear away the dead leaves which will expose the crown to frost so as to ensure a good crop of stalks for next year.

2) If you have beetroot growing, now is a good time to harvest them. Carrots should be left in place and covered with straw or cardboard to protect them from frost. However, a sharp frost can improve the flavour of parsnips and swedes.

3} Now is the time to sow green manures such as grazing rye and winter field beans. This will, when dug in later, promote good soil structure and reduce weeds.

4} Whole books have been written on the subject of composting, the art of providing a good supply of well-rotted organic matter with which you can improve your garden and avoid the carbon emissions associated with transporting your garden waste elsewhere. However, there are some underlying principles which can guide us as gardeners.

(a) If choosing plastic bin, opt for one as large as possible. If you go down the wooden plank route, then aim for one around 1 cubic metre. One with removable fronts allows for turning and removing the compost more easily.

(b) When choosing what to compost, aim for no more than 25 to 50% green materials. A good mixture of prunings [cut small or shredded], wood chippings, paper, straw or dead leaves, will ensure a healthy mixture.

(c) Try if possible, to have two compost heaps/bins - one that is being filled and one that is covered and composting down.

(d) Do watch out for vegetable invaders. Pieces of potatoes can grow into plants, as can tomato, melon and squash seeds seeds which can germinate in the compost and become 'weeds' once they have been spread out.

In conclusion, a quote from Sara Coleridge:

"Dull November brings the blast, The leaves are swirling fast."



Reports from Representatives on Outside Bodies

Dist Cllrs Ashton & Jones reported:

ELDC are supporting a Public Sector Hub at Horncastle together with Boston College and LCC. The aim is for ELDC to relocate from Tedder Hall. ELDC have been given the go ahead to set up an investment company to allow ELDC to make a profit. ELDC are just ahead of their targets, but still feel improvements need to be made. Data from the planning annual satisfaction survey will change to allow for more useful data to be collected for use by future applicants. ELDC could receive a grant of £25m from Central Government Better Communities Grant

County Cllr Bowkett reported by email:

Parishes are being asked to include clearing snow from footways in the emergency plan, extra salt can be requested for this task. Grit bins need to be checked and refilled where necessary. Grants, in the form of vouchers, are available for communities to obtain a better broadband service.

The PCSO reported by email:

Checks are regularly made at the play area and there seems to be no problems there.
