ST LUKE'S CHURCH

It is good to be able to bring you up to date about what is happening in our Church. The building may be closed, but the Church is still active and open!

We celebrated Easter in a different way this year, an Easter Garden was set up on the Rectory lawn and shown on Facebook. I have received a number of positive comments about it from people who saw it whilst out on their daily exercise. I have also sent out (almost) daily emails to members of our congregations who were willing to receive them. Many of our members are in the elderly and vulnerable bracket, but those who can have been assisting in the community by doing shopping trips, delivering prescriptions and sewing scrubs or face masks. It has been good to be part of the Church in Action.

However, the lockdown has caused us to cancel a number of fund-raising activities and we are still unsure when we might get back to a full opening of the buildings. Please read the separate article included in this edition of Stickney News and, if you can help, do.

We felt it was important to keep our Christian Aid support going, particularly during the coronavirus crisis, and so we held a collection by placing buckets in strategic places and advertising them on Facebook and on Nextdoor. It was extremely gratifying to be able to send £130 for the charity – less than normal, but, as the saying goes, every little bit helps.

You will have seen that the Church building is now able to open for individual private prayer. The announcement came as a bit of surprise, as it was not expected until early July, and it is far more difficult to open a church than to close one. However, we believe we can open St Luke's Church for a limited time each week – on Mondays and Thursdays from 10.00am – 11.00am. Please do come and use the church if you would find it helpful. We are doing everything we can to make sure your visit will be safe, including setting up a one-way system around the church and encouraging social distancing.

However, we are NOT able, at this time, to either sell or accept delivery of books or jumble.

We are very much looking forward to a time when we can meet together again

St Luke's Church Gift Day

As a PCC we want to thank those who have asked how the coronavirus pandemic is going to affect St Luke's Church here in Stickney.

As you know Church services will continue to be suspended for the foreseeable future, and all our fundraising activities have had to cease. There are many consequences to this, not least for our finances. Without the collections on Sundays, the fees and collections from wedding and funerals and income from our fundraising events, our income has almost disappeared.

Our fixed outgoings for insurance and utilities continue and there is the ongoing need to maintain the building! Despite what you hear about the Church 'having plenty of money', the reality is very different. St Luke's Church continues to survive because of the generosity of people in the village. Our insurance premium, due this month, is £3367.13, and that is just one of the demands which is pressing.

Each year we hold a gift day and invite people to come to Church to make donations to keep the Church open. We are always amazed at the generosity and willingness of the community to support the Church. Please don't let this year be the exception.

We will be holding our gift day on Saturday 04 July, and there will be buckets in strategic places to accept your donations. Also, we are giving the possibility of making a payment online direct into our bank.

Kiddies Corner

Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients

- 150g salted butter, softened
- 80g light brown sugar
- 80g granulated sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 large egg
- 225g plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- ¼ tsp salt
- 200g plain chocolate chips or chunks

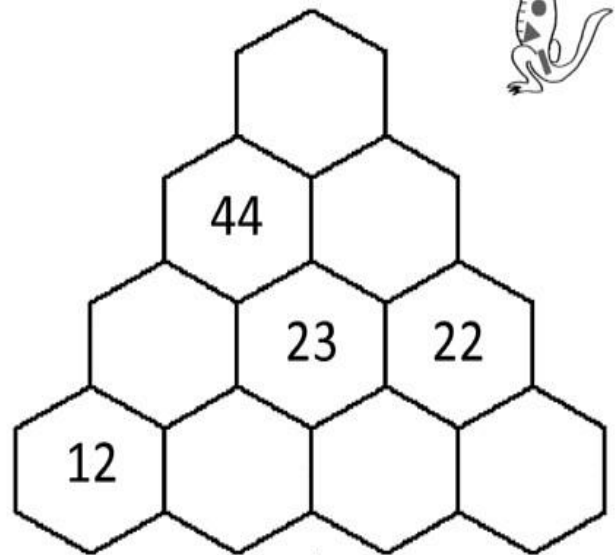
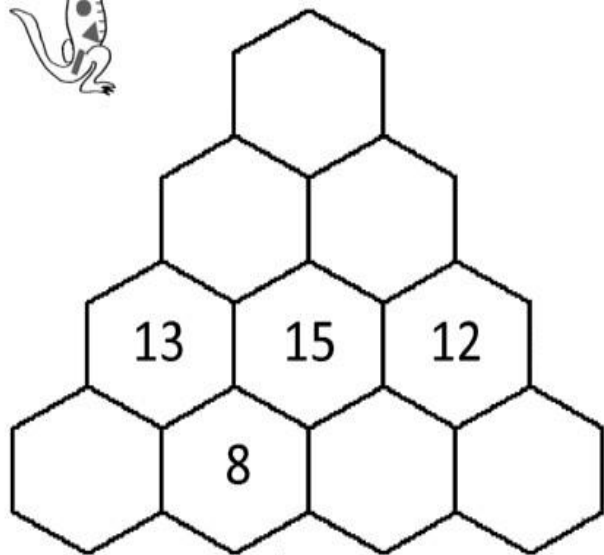
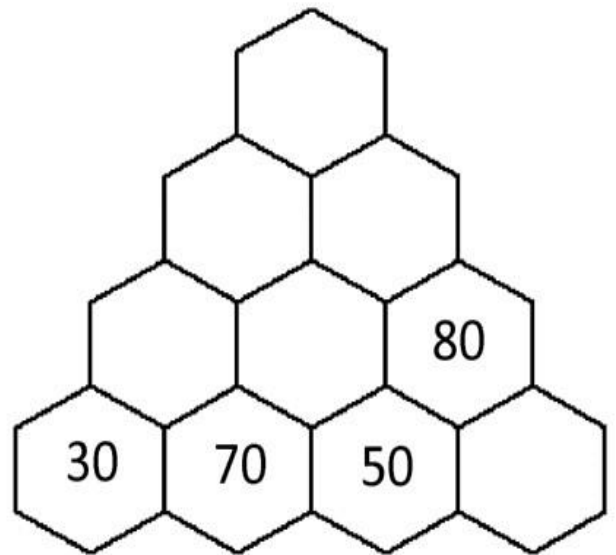
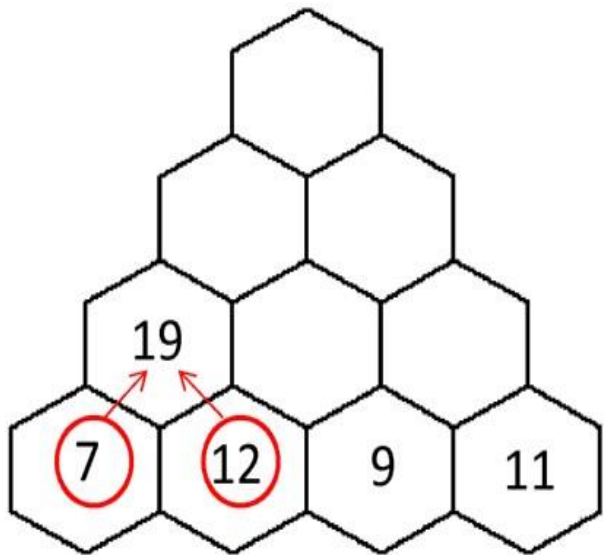


Method

1. Heat the oven to 190C/fan170C/gas 5 and line two baking sheets with non-stick baking paper.
 2. Put 150g softened salted butter, 80g light brown sugar and 80g granulated sugar into a bowl and beat until creamy.
 3. Beat in 2 tsp vanilla extract and 1 large egg.
 4. Sift 225g plain flour, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda and ¼ tsp salt into the bowl and mix it in with a wooden spoon.
 5. Add 200g plain chocolate chips or chunks and stir well.
 6. Use a teaspoon to make small scoops of the mixture, spacing them well apart on the baking trays. *(This mixture should make about 30 cookies)*
 7. Bake for 8–10 mins until they are light brown on the edges and still slightly soft in the centre if you press them.
 8. Leave on the tray for a couple of mins to set and then lift onto a cooling rack.

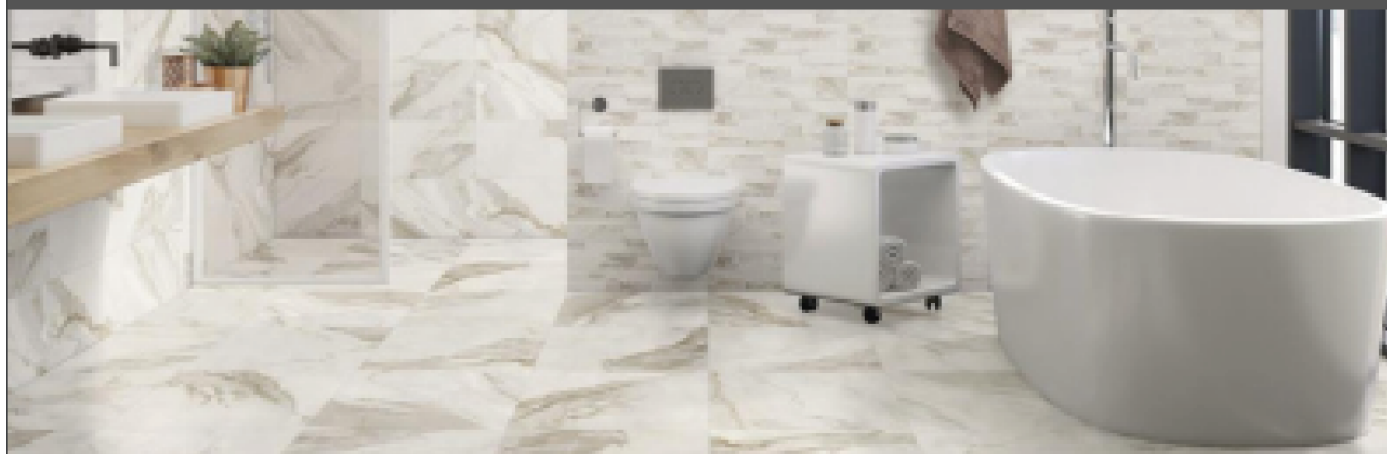

It has been a strange start to summer term but that hasn't dampened our spirits! We continue to support all our families despite only physically welcoming in a small number of children at this time. Our children and staff have been keeping in touch through Zoom meetings with the focus on promoting mental wellbeing and a feeling of connectedness.

Our school is looking very different with new systems in place to keep everyone safe, including regular handwashing and multiple new sanitiser stations as well as smiley faces marked outside to encourage social-distancing when coming to school.

Our children in and out of school have been using the BBC Bitesize resources to continue their education during the partial school closures and we are so proud of each and every one of them for doing their best during this difficult time.

Many of our families and staff have used this time as an opportunity for innovation and creation! We've been overwhelmed, and heart warmed, by the stories and photographs that have been shared with us showing our children gardening, cooking, baking and making!

We are missing seeing all of our children every day and we are praying that our school can soon be full of all the little people who bring it to life.

We have had much to celebrate during 2020, having been taken out of Special Measures in February! With a clear plan of action in place, we hope that the school's reputation within both the village and across Boston will continue to improve as student numbers increase and funding is enhanced.

Throughout the Covid-19 crisis, the school has been working hard to support the families of key workers and vulnerable children within the community, during both term time and school holidays. We have received some heart-warming offers of thanks for this provision.

Staff have also been conducting regular welfare checks on children at home. We have made sure to check in on families regarding access to remote learning, general wellbeing, and basic necessities such as food and supplies.

We are now offering a fully timetabled remote offer via Microsoft Teams. Students can log into their Team and retrieve work for each lesson. Many lessons also include a live video-conference, so students can ask questions, and webinars, so that students can be talked through the specifics of new knowledge and skills. Parents and carers have been hugely supportive of the school's efforts. This is such a new way of working, there are bound to be teething problems, but so far, the impact has been remarkable, with students engaging far more easily with their learning from home.

We have also been busy working on arrangements for the students who will join us in September. There is plenty of information on our website, including a photo tour of the school.

Within the building, we have been busy making changes to support social distancing efforts, including establishing one-way systems around the school.

From September, there are also exciting plans for staffing, with a new Deputy Headteacher and some additional teaching staff. Despite the Covid-19 crisis, the school remains dedicated to driving improvements in the quality of education, securing the future of the school for years to come.

Gardening Tips for July:

With 'lockdown' our gardens should all be 'in hand', but just in case you haven't got all the jobs done here are a few reminders:

{1} Tomatoes will be growing vigorously by now and you may even have the first signs of fruit on the plants. The important thing, at the moment, is to keep the soil moist at all times but not continuously wet. Avoid erratic watering which can cause the fruit to split. On the other hand, dryness can lead to blossom end rot. Feed with a tomato fertiliser using the manufacturer's instructions after the first truss of flowers open. Finally, allow four trusses of fruit per plant outdoors and six under glass, before removing the growing tip.

{2} Remove strawberry runners during the early part of the summer. This prevents energy being diverted from the developing fruit. If you wish to increase your stocks or if you intend starting a new bed of strawberries, peg the runners into pots of compost or directly into gaps between late summer and early autumn.

{3} Keep picking courgettes. It's wonderful the way they can develop from a 'something almost too-small-to-pick' fruit into something resembling a large marrow while your back was turned! Courgettes are prolific growers and can lead to a glut, a situation which can lead to what the poet Mary Percy describes in her poem:

'Attack of the Squash People'

when people:

"sneak out before dawn to drop
them in other peoples' gardens,
in baby buggies at church doors"

{4} If we do get a dry summer and water becomes scarce, be sure to prioritise which of your vegetables should receive your watering attention. Keep soil cool in hot weather by adding a 4" layer of mulch if possible. Only irrigate early in the morning or in the evening to offset evaporation. Concentrate on seedlings and on leafy vegetables such as lettuce, spinach and cabbage. Root vegetables don't need as much water, but if possible, irrigate every fortnight if it hasn't rained.

Runner beans need to be watered throughout for good pod set. It goes without saying, that fruit crops such as tomatoes, sweetcorn and courgettes need plenty of water to enable fruit to ripen.

In conclusion a little quote I picked up by an unknown wag:

Gardening is a matter of one's enthusiasm holding up until one's back gets used to it!

This certainly resonates with me!

NHS Test and Trace

If NHS Test and Trace calls you by phone, the service will be using a single phone number 0300 0135 000. The only website the service will ask you to visit is <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk>.

Contact tracers will never:

- Ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to us (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- Ask you to make any form of payment
- Ask for any details about your bank account
- Ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- Ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- Ask you to purchase a product
- Ask you to download any software to your device or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet
- Ask you to access any website that does not belong to the Government or NHS

Tv Licensing Scam

We have seen an increase in the reports of fake TV Licensing emails. These emails may claim that you need to renew your licence, or that your direct debit has failed. These are phishing emails which contain links to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal personal and financial information. You will be asked to enter your personal details, and update your banking details.

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.

If you have received such an email, you can report it to:

If you believe you have entered your personal details after receiving an email like this, please contact your bank to safeguard your funds.



Fraud Alert

We have seen an increase in incidents where victims are receiving a telephone call purporting to be from a police officer telling the victim that their bank cards/account has been used and that the police have an offender in custody. If you receive such a call, **do not give any of your details**, put the phone down, wait for ten minutes, and then call the police on 101. The 101 system will automatically direct your call to your relevant police area depending on where you are calling from.

Fraudsters will try and give you a different number saying it is a direct line, it may even come back as a genuine number if you google it, but if you are not expecting a call from the police, hang up and follow the advice above/given in this message.

Stop - Hang up - Wait 10 minutes - Use 101

Reports from Representatives on Outside Bodies

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

ELDC are currently deterring visitors to the East Coast. £32m has been given to small businesses in the form of grants. ELDC are joining executive ranks with Boston Borough Council, making a saving of £1.5m. District Councillors have been given £1000 to distribute in the form of a grant to help any Covid 19 support groups

County Cllr Bowkett reported:

LCC are working with other partners to support residents and businesses through the pandemic. County Cllrs have a grant to support their Division, there is £1500 left should it be needed. Household waste recycling centres will be open from 18 May for green waste and wood only, slots for drop off have to be booked. The grass verge cutting has started, details can be found on the LCC website. The new programme of works can also be found on the LCC website. Details of new working gangs were outlined for smaller jobs, footway/drain jobs, drainage gangs and operative patching gangs.

Cemetery

The Duty of Care: Waste Transfer Note has been completed and returned to UK Waste Solutions.

A letter has been received from ELDC for the Parish Council to claim a £10,000 small business grant in respect of the cemetery, this has not been applied for. The mole control contract has been renewed for the cemetery at a cost of £375.00 per year.

Primary School

A letter of support for a Triton Knoll grant to extend the car park has been sent to the Primary School.

Audit for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The hand-held speed equipment has been removed from the assets register and the notice board has been added. The Fixed Assets Register will be signed by the Chairman in due course, ready for the Internal Audit.

Statement of Accounts

The Clerk read out the figures in the Statement of Accounts. The figures were approved by the Councillors present. The Chairman will sign the paperwork in due course, along with the Certificate of Exemption.

Annual Governance Statement

The Chairman read out the statements and the boxes were ticked following responses from the Councillors present. The paperwork will be signed in due course

Play Area

The play area is currently locked, the grass cutters have a key for access.

Planning Applications Received

The Parish Council have looked at and **SUPPORTED**:
