We have opened St Luke's Church for services, and for individual private prayer. We are having ongoing discussions about how we might make use of the building so that people can come and make use of the book stall – but there are so many regulations it is not easy to pick a way through to make it happen. We have decided to retain our current pattern of worship within the cluster throughout August, which gives us time to make decisions about a wider re-opening in September, subject, of course, to social distancing and national guidelines.

These Christmas Gifts of money are awarded as part of a historic custom of gifting milk or coal to residents in the village of Stickney over the last 100 years and more.

Over past years the amount of the gift has been pre-determined and restricted to a specific number of people as recognised by the Board of Trustees. Although the amount of money set aside for Christmas gifts has not changed the Trustees decided to try a different approach in 2018. This means there will be no limit on the number of recipients but the amount of money for the Christmas gift will vary according to the number of people who apply.

Although the Trustees have been able to set some of the criteria for applying, they are bound by the Governing Documents of the Charities and are not currently able to make many changes. A good example of this is that it is specified that only widows and spinsters are eligible, whereas if the documents had been drawn up now, this would not be acceptable!

Ingredients

1/4 cup plain flour
1/4 cup packed light or dark brown sugar
2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
Pinch of salt
2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons milk, coffee or water
2 tablespoons chocolate chips
Preparation
1. Mix together the flour, sugar, cocoa powder, and salt until smooth in a small bowl.
2. Add the oil, milk, and chocolate chips. Mix until

thick and stiff and pour into a microwave-safe cup, mug or ramekin.

3. Cook in the microwave for 1¹/₂ minutes for a gooey brownie, 2¹/₂ minutes for a well-done brownie



Gardening Tips for August and September:

What a blessing it has been these past few months of lockdown to have access to a garden and in particular, a vegetable garden. Somehow it has been a symbol of hope and has provided many of us with something to look forward to. Except for early on when seeds and compost were both in short supply, things seem to be getting back to normal, so here are a few things we might be getting on with in the next couple of months.

August:

{1} As you clear your garden of peas and beans it might be wise to consider using the space to grow some onion sets for next year. A favourite of mine is the Senshya Semi-Globe Yellow onion sets for a mid to late August sowing to harvest in July.

{2} Pinch out the tips of climbing shoots of runner beans as they reach the top of the support frame.

{3} Keep cutting tender courgettes. This ensures that the plant will keep producing until later in the summer.

{4} Side shoots on tomato plants should be pinched out. Then, the leading shoot to the supports. Keep feeding on a regular (weekly) basis with a high potash tomato fertiliser. Never let plants go short of water.

{5} Another crop which benefits from regular picking is the cucumber. The tips of any side shoots should be pinched out just two leaves beyond any fruit that may be developing. Again, feed and water.

{6} Look out for late season potato tubers now to plant and look forward to an October/November harvest.

September:

{1} Now is the time to sow winter lettuce. My favourite two are Valdor and Winter Density. It's also worth considering a few 'cut-and-come-again' salad varieties. These can be sown and then planted in pots near the house for ease of picking.

{2} When it is time to lift maincrop potatoes, it is important to allow them to dry prior to storing in paper sacks in a dark cool place.

{3} If you have any spring cabbage which you intend to transplant, now is the optimum time to do it.

{4} If you didn't get around to lifting and storing your main crop onion in August, now is the time to do it. Only ripe bulbs will store well throughout the winter, so lift the bulb, discarding any which show signs of rot and place them on a spot with full sun to ripen off thoroughly. A greenhouse or any cold frames are ideal places for this.

{5} Finally, cut off a few leaves of your tomato plants to expose the fruit to the sun and allow them to ripen that much quicker.

Dist Cllr Jones reported:

ELDC are now amalgamating senior management positions with Boston Borough Council. The s73 application at Stickney Meadows will probably go ahead due to there being no increase in the number of properties on the site.

Dist Cllr Ashton reported:

LCC have had the first remote meeting to enable the Council business to continue. There will be no redundancies at either ELDC or Boston BC following the amalgamation of senior positions. All services will continue to be run by each Council individually. The ELDC Planning Policy is being reviewed.

7.45pm Dist Cllrs Ashton and Jones left the remote meeting

County Cllr Bowkett reported:

LCC are in discussions about potential devolution. Household waste recycling sites have re-opened. LCC are looking at getting children back into schools safely. The LCC Resilience Forum and Well Being Service are still working to help vulnerable residents in Lincolnshire.

Picnic Area

An email from LCC regarding the picnic site was read out. The picnic benches will be replaced with two new ones and some benches. The sign at the entrance will be cleaned. New Dog fouling signs will be requested.

Play Area Report

Paperwork regarding the opening of play areas, with details of cleaning the equipment and sanitising everything whilst expecting users to sanitise their hands regularly, has been sent to all Councillors. It was resolved that the play area remain locked.
