ST LUKE'S CHURCH

I have good news – Christmas is NOT cancelled, and New Year will come along as normal. We don't know yet what we can or cannot do in the Church, so Christmas is probably going to look very different this year, but we will still celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Because of the pandemic, it is very difficult to plan anything, particularly as we are currently in lockdown. Usually I would be able to let you know what services are planned, and I could rely on the information being available in every home through the Stickney News. All I can do this year is to let you know what we hope to do, and ask you to check out the details on the Church noticeboard or on Facebook – like The Stickney Cluster of Churches page!

<u> Kiddies Corner</u>

Peanut Butter Chocolate Fudge with Pretzels

This Peanut Butter Chocolate Fudge with Pretzels is a sweet and salty Christmas candy that is SO easy to make! Just a few ingredients and no bake.

Ingredients

- 370g cups finely chopped chocolate
- 300 ml sweetened condensed milk
- 1/4 cup smooth peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons smooth peanut butter
- 1/4 cup chopped salted peanuts
- 1/4 cup chopped pretzels

Method

- \checkmark Line an 8×8" pan with wax or parchment paper.
- In a large microwave-safe bowl, combine chocolate, condensed milk and ¼ cup peanut butter.
- Microwave on high in 20-25 second intervals, stirring well each time, until smooth (mixture will be thick - do not overcook!).
- Spread half into prepared pan. Place a piece of wax paper on top and press fudge into the pan. Warm 2 tablespoons peanut butter for 15 seconds in the microwave, and drizzle half over fudge in pan. Top with half peanuts and half pretzels.
- Repeat layers one more time, with the remaining fudge, peanut butter, peanuts and pretzels, using the same piece of wax paper to press your fudge into the pan (it will be impossible to spread otherwise!).
- Refrigerate until set, or place in the freezer for 15-20 minutes until firm.
- $\checkmark\,$ Slice and serve. Store leftovers in the refrigerator or freezer.

Gardening Tips for December and January

This is the time of year to prepare for next year's activities. When the weather is changeable, and the days are short it is important to grab time in the garden when you can. The more you get done now, the better you'll be set up for next year. Here then are a few jobs we can safely do in the garden without the need to put on our face masks!

1) Garlic plants should be growing on at a pace. Heavy or wet soil can cause the cloves to rot. A way round this is to use a small dibber to make a hole into which gritty sand can be dropped before dropping the clove in. Alternatively plant the clove in a 3" pot under glass and then plant out when the shoots are about an inch high.

2) A top tip if you are growing Brussels sprouts, is to apply some extra nitrogen. This can be done in the form of sulphate of ammonia at the rate of 1oz per yard², dissolved in water. A couple of teaspoons of dried blood sprinkled around the base of the plant and watered in will have a similar beneficial effect.

3} Autumn planted broad beans can go in now but be aware that wet soils can be a barrier to your success rate. Hardy peas such as 'meteor' can also go in now.

4) Continue to check your stored potatoes and throw away any that are showing signs of damage. They will only rot and affect the others if left together. Also check stored onions and garlic and remove any rotting bulbs immediately. The neck of the bulb is usually the first area to rot.

5} Lift your late leeks and parsnips before the soil becomes frozen. Heel them into a trench beside a convenient path and they'll be ready to be brought indoors as and when required.

6} Cover heavy clay soil with polythene to keep it drier and to stop any nutrients from leeching away with the winter rains.

In conclusion, a quote from Liberty Hyde Bailey, an American scientist, who wrote:

"A garden requires patient labour and attention.

Plants do not grow merely to satisfy or to fulfil good intentions.

They thrive because someone expended effort on them."

Reports from Representatives in Outside Bodies

There were no representatives from outside bodies present.

Planning Applications received

The following planning application was **OBJECTED** to by the Parish Council:

S/169/01887/20 - Bowbridge (Kier) Limited - Section 73 application in relation to condition no 4 (affordable housing) as imposed on planning permission reference S/169/00775/05 which was for erection of 46 houses; construction of vehicular access and estate roads. Private drives, car parking area and footpaths; and pumping station; provision of public open space and erection of screen walls (2 metre max height), dwarf wall and railings (1.5 metre max height) and dwarf wall (1 metre max height) at Land north of Hall Lane.

Having checked with a local housing association it was confirmed that there is a need for affordable housing in this area. The drainage for the cemetery runs across the site and the developer needs to be reminded of this.

Play Area

The current Government guidelines are to keep play areas open. Please remember to sanitise the equipment before and after use and to wash everyone's hands on returning home. Thank you for not putting dog bags in the play area bins.

Draft Budget for 2021/2022

The draft budget was presented and discussed. The precept for 2021/2022 will be £22,000, this will be confirmed at the next meeting.

A dead tree will be inspected for removal in the Churchyard, a faculty will be required for this work to be carried out. When visiting the cemetery and Churchyard could everyone please consider other visitors that may be there at the same time – thank you.
